NOTICE OF ELECTION FOR LEVIES OUTSIDE THE SIX PERCENT CONSTITUTIONAL LIMITATION IN SCHOOL DISTRICT NO. 4 OF DOUGLAS COUNTY, OREGON

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that at the special election to be held within School District No. 4 of Douglas County, Oregon, on Friday, June 16, 1956, between the hours of 2 o'clock P.M. and 8 o'clock P.M., there will be submitted the following separate questions of making special tax levies outside of the six percent limitation of the Oregon Constitution as follows:

"Shall a special tax levy in the sum of \$1,045,714.72 over and above the six percent limitation of the Oregon Constitution be made by School District No. 4 of Douglas County, Oregon, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1956, for the purpose of defraying the cost of increased enrollment including teachers' salaries, normal operating cost of the district?"

And "Shall a special tax levy in the sum of \$12,000.00 over and above the six percent limitation of the Oregon Constitution be made by School District No. 4 of Douglas County, Oregon, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1956, to provide funds for expenditure for the securing of professional services, and to implement and assist in the evaluation of the purposes, aims and accomplishments of the district?"

On each of said propositions the vote shall be by ballot, upon which shall be the words "Tax Levy - Yes" and "Tax Levy - No," and the voters shall place a cross (X) between the words "Tax Levy - Yes," or between the words "Tax Levy - No," whichever indicates his choice.

Said election for the submission of said propositions shall be held at the following polling places for the following school election precincts comprising the following areas:

SCHOOL PRECINCT NO. 1. Polling place, Central Junior High Building, for all legal voters of the district from Umpqua, Benson, Lane, Deer Creek, East Mill, and Election precincts.

SCHOOL PRECINCT NO. 2. Polling place, Senior High School, for all legal voters of the district from Brown, North Brown, Fairhaven, Laurelwood, West Roseburg, Wharton, Park and Orchard election precincts.

SCHOOL PRECINCT NO. 3. Polling place, Riverside School, for all legal voters of the district from Hamilton, Woodward, Caro, Herman, Roseburg, Miller and THAT PART OF PARROTT LIVING NORTH OF THE JUNCTION OF THE OLD HIGHWAY 99 AND THE PRESENT HIGHWAY 99 election precincts.

SCHOOL PRECINCT NO. 4. Polling place, Rose School, for all legal voters of the district from Hamilton, Woodward, Caro, Herman, Roseburg, Miller and THAT PART OF PARROTT LIVING NORTH OF THE JUNCTION OF THE OLD HIGHWAY 99 AND THE PRESENT HIGHWAY 99 election precincts.

SCHOOL PRECINCT NO. 5. Polling place, Melrose School, for all legal voters of the district from the Melrose election precinct, or residing within what was formerly School District No. 71 (Melrose).

SCHOOL PRECINCT NO. 6. Polling place, Green School, for all legal voters of the district from Green, West Green and THAT PART OF PARROTT LIVING SOUTH OF THE JUNCTION OF THE OLD HIGHWAY 99 AND THE PRESENT HIGHWAY 99 election precincts.

SCHOOL PRECINCT NO. 7. Polling place, Winchester School, for all legal voters of the district from Wilbur and Winchester election precincts.

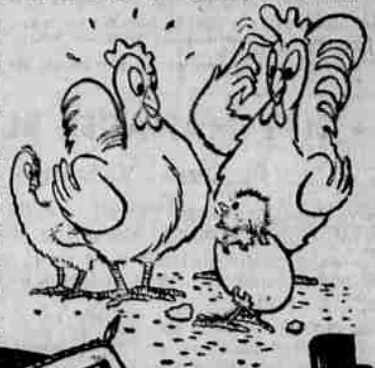
Michigan Unemployment Climbs Up To 190,000

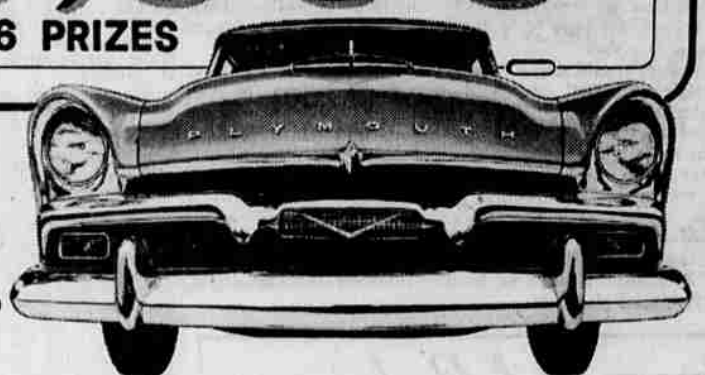
