Show theme is "Holidays In Oregon," reports Correspondent Jean Yoder. Individuals and organizations have been invited to enter exhibits. There will be several displays.

The show is divided into three divisions: Adult, Junior (13 to 18 years); and children (up to 12). Exhibitors may exhibit only one entry in each class. All entries must be in place by 11 a.m. and left until 4:30 p.m. Saturday. Entries may be placed, starting at 9 a.m. Ribbon awards will be given.

Mrs. L. E. Adams, an accredited flower show judge from Roseburg, will judge single horticultural specimens. Arrangements will be judged by visitors in a popular vote who are registered before 2 p.m. A plant sale is planned. Refreshments will be available.

Classes in the following schedule are competitive: 1. Horticultural single specimens: Roses — red, white, pink, yellow, bicolor and single; iris — dutch, Spanish, bearded (shades of blue, brown, purple and lavender, red and pink, yellow, white); calla lily, columbine, delphinium, lily, snapdragon, peony, rhododendron, other flowers, house plants (African violets, begonias, and other flowering plants, foliage plants). 2. Arrangements: Adults — As you like it, baskets (low and tall), center (low), driftwood with flowers, mantle, miniatures, roses, columbines, iris, song or book title. 3. Shadow boxes. 4. Dish gardens. 5. Organizations. 6. Arrangements: Junior and children: As you like it, dish gardens, wild flowers. 7. Holidays In Oregon: Live flowers, dried arrangements, mixed greens and cones, added material arrangements.
