

Chicago Hurler Whiffs Four Men In One Inning

ST. LOUIS (AP) — Jim Davis, Chicago Cub relief pitcher, joined five other pitchers Sunday who have performed the unusual feat of striking out four batters in one inning.

In the sixth inning of Sunday's first game between Chicago and St. Louis, Wally Moon doubled and stole third. Davis struck out Hal Smith and Jackie Brandt. Relief pitcher Lindy McDaniel also fanned but catcher Hobie Landrith missed the third strike and McDaniel reached first and Moon scored on the error.

Davis then fanned Don Blasingame for his fourth victim of the inning.

It was the first time since 1916 that it's happened and Davis became the fifth pitcher in history to turn the trick. Bobby Matthews of Philadelphia fanned four in one inning in 1885 and Ed Crane of New York duplicated it in 1888.

Three others have done it since the turn of the century. George (Hooks) Wittse of the Giants in 1905, Walter Johnson of Washington in 1911 and Guy Morton of Cleveland accomplished the feat in 1916.

Swiss Team Again Tops World's Highest Peak

KATMANDU, Nepal (AP) — A Swiss mountaineering expedition has made two climbs to the top of Mt. Everest, the world's highest peak, and also conquered the neighboring mountain, Ilhotse-I, a Nepalese government spokesman announced Monday.

Two Swiss, Ernst Schmidt and Jurg Marjet, climbed to the top of 29,028-foot Mt. Everest on May 23, he said. They were the second team to make the climb successfully, duplicating the feat of Sir Edmund Hillary and Sherpa Norgay Tenzing, members of a British expedition who first reached the top May 29, 1953.

The next day, the spokesman said, a second team of Swiss made it to the summit of Mt. Everest.

On May 18, Ernst Reiss and Fritz Luchsinger of the 13-man Swiss group reached the top of Ilhotse-I, 27,870 feet high.

PORTLAND (AP) — Nine records were broken in the district 2 NAIA track and field meet here Saturday. Lewis and Clark of Portland easily won the meet, taking firsts in seven of the 15 events.

Lewis and Clark scored 99 points. Then came Pacific 38 1/2, Eastern Oregon 34, University of Portland 28 1/2, Willamette 24, Linfield 17 1/2, Southern Oregon 16, Oregon College of Education 12, and Portland State 11 1/2.

Dean Benson of Willamette was timed in 14.1 seconds for the high hurdles. Only four other collegiate hurdlers have turned in better times this spring.

Purchase Negotiations For Rams Stalemated

LOS ANGELES (AP) — A tug-of-war for control of the Los Angeles Rams professional football club was stalemated Monday.

Partner Dan Reeves, a wealthy broker, didn't come up with \$2,000,000 over the weekend to buy out the two-thirds ownership held by Ed Pauley, Fred Levy and Hal Seley.

Nor did he accept the \$1,000,000 offered for his one-third share by the majority owners.

Pauley, Levy and Seley made public their offer—giving Reeves the option of either buying or selling—Saturday. They gave him until June 18 to make a decision.

Morocco May Demand Rental For Air Bases

Members of the Moroccan government have hinted that rental money may be demanded from the United States for the right to continue using the bases, which were built at a cost of about 500 million dollars.

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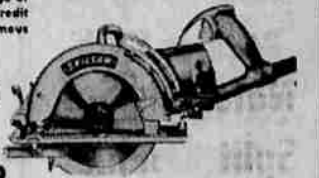
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
