Award of the contract will be made within the next 45 days, Moore said.

The new control house was called for because of the installation of a second 6,000-kilovolt transformer at the station in September to meet rapidly growing loads in the area.

She was elected at a regional conference for the Eugene-Springfield-Roseburg area at Springfield over the weekend. She will act on the board compiling statistics and materials for a state-wide preschool organization.

Dr. Marian Taylor, instructor at the University and professional advisor of the group, led a discussion panel on the needs and problems of day nurseries at the session.

A business meeting was also held to discuss plans for a state-wide conference to be held at the University of Oregon in early October.

Ideas were discussed for classifying certified nurseries into three groups, depending on physical plant equipment, qualified personnel and experience. Mrs. Reesman emphasized that a new state law has been passed stating that any person keeping two or more children in their home for pay must apply for certification from the State Board of Health. She said any such place is considered a day nursery by law and is subject to inspection by the state board.

Plans were made at the conference for a series of workshops next fall to be held periodically for day-nursery personnel. Dr. Taylor is formulating plans for leadership and instruction in these classes.

Mr. and Mrs. Clarence Bowker and two children returned Friday to their home on Ford's Drive in south Winston, following a business trip to Seattle, Wash.

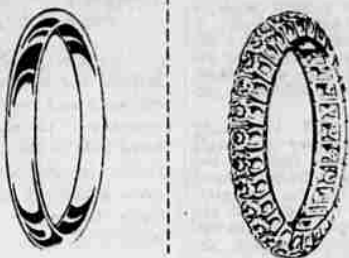

They were accompanied on the trip by Karen Owens and Vicki Peterson.

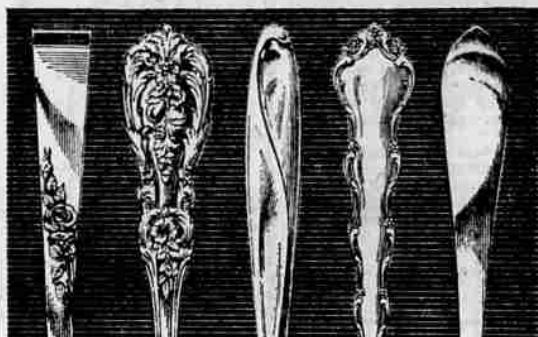

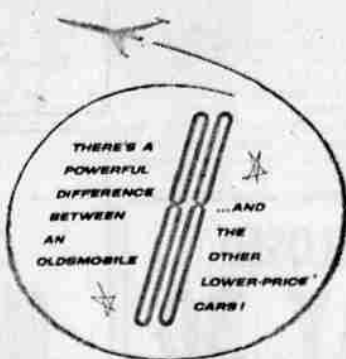
