NEW DELHI, India (AP)—France Monday formally transferred her four little settlements on the Indian Coast to Prime Minister Nehru's government.

The pact covers the four settlements of Pondicherry, Karikal and Yanam on the east coast and Mahe on the west. They have been French since the 18th century. The French settlements total 193 square miles in area and have a population of more than 317,000.

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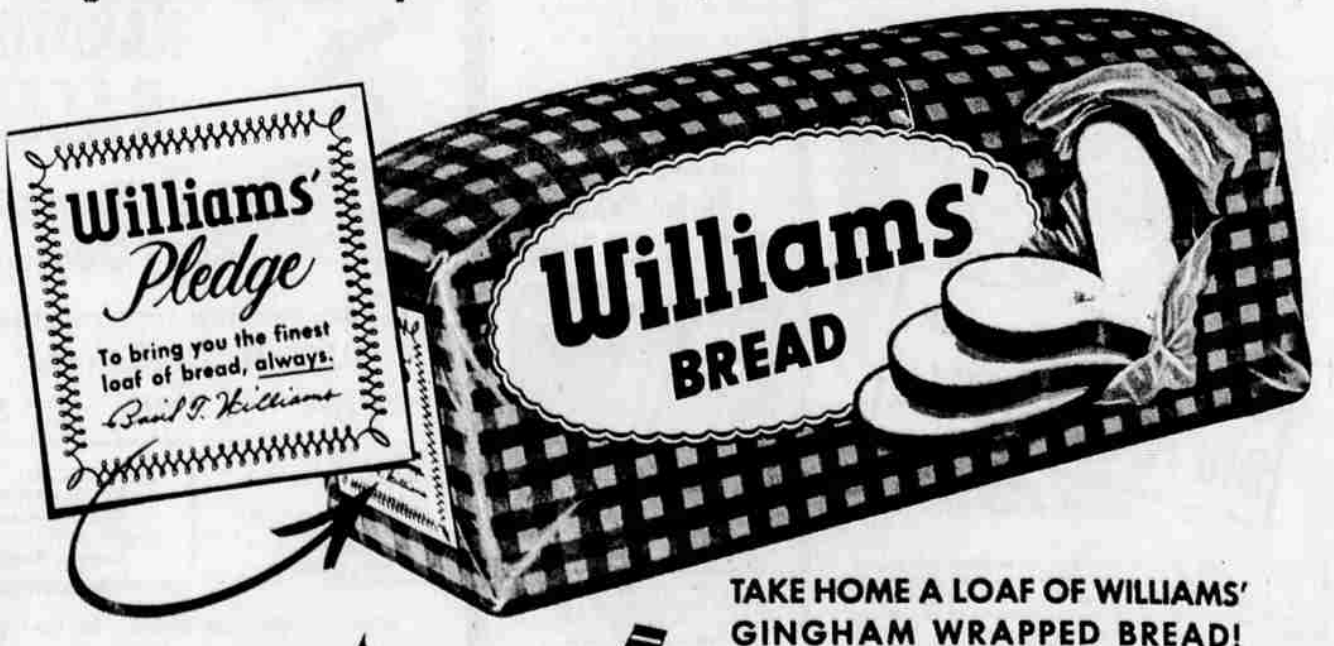
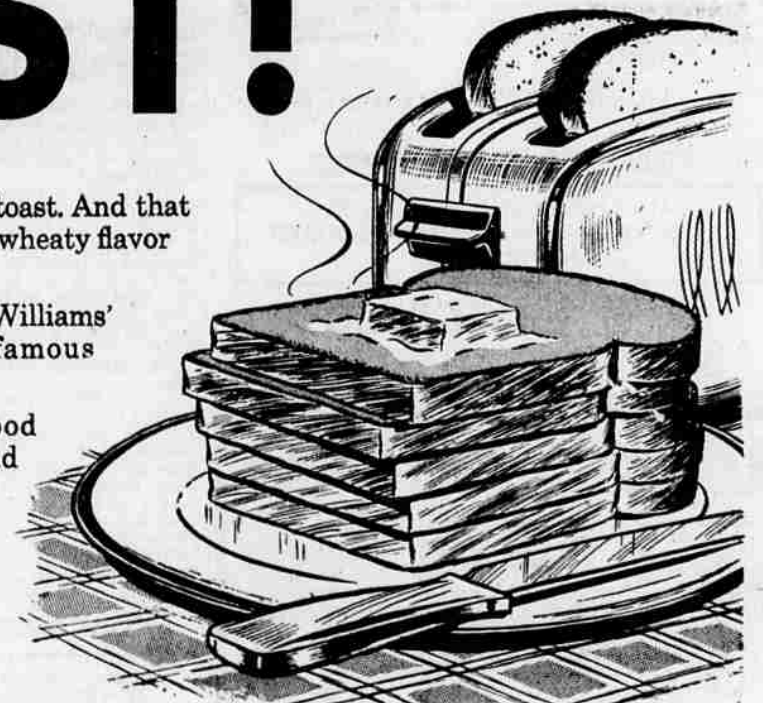
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
