

Home Burns To Ground As Boy Gabs On Phone

STATESVILLE, N.C. — A \$15,000 rural home burned to the ground this week while a boy gabbled on a telephone party line, refusing to yield it for a call to the fire department.

Mrs. Paul Phillips said she broke into the conversation. "I told him my house was on fire and I wanted to call the fire department, but he said, 'Are you kidding?' and went on talking."

As she was leaving to seek another telephone, a neighbor, Hoyle Eller, drove up. He ran into the flaming house and pleaded with the boy to get off the phone.

"Let it burn," the boy said.

Eller then went to another house and called firemen. When they arrived the fire was beyond control. The house burned down.

Ike Cautions Backers Not To Be Complacent

WASHINGTON — President Eisenhower Thursday cautioned his political supporters against complacency in this year's campaign. He urged them to work hard for continuance of what he called his administration's "great middle of the road philosophy of government."

In an informal address at a Citizens for Eisenhower national campaign conference, Eisenhower also called for election of a Republican Congress this fall to supplant present Democratic control at the capitol.

Eisenhower got a rousing ovation at the start and at the conclusion of his remarks to an audience of about 500 persons at the Statler Hotel. The Citizens for Eisenhower Committee was created in 1952 to rally independent

voters and dissatisfied Democrats to the Eisenhower banner.

At the outset of his talk the President recalled it was exactly four years ago Thursday that he left Paris to return to this country to bid for the presidency.

Eisenhower alluded to his heart attack last September at one point and then touched off a laugh in saying that the only way he was now of knowing he was ill "is that the doctors keep reminding me."

The President added that he is now ready to "go forward" into the campaign and to work cheerfully and energetically for victory in November.

The goal, he declared, is "clean government, good government, progressive government and government that knows its place and

doesn't interfere with me as I go about my duties."

The last part of that remark brought a laugh. The President did not elaborate on it.

Joe Chamberlain Joins Business At Hillsboro

Former Roseburg business man Joe V. Chamberlain has announced he will move to Hillsboro next week where he has purchased a financial interest in Hunter Gard Motors, Inc. He will be vice president of the newly-formed corporation and dealer for Chrysler and Plymouth automobiles.
