Playwright Mum On Plans To Wed Marilyn Monroe

RENO, Nev. (AP) — Playwright Arthur Miller has declined to comment on whether he plans to marry screen star Marilyn Monroe now that he has completed the six-week residence requirement for a Nevada divorce.

Columnists have predicted the marriage before the blonde actress goes to Europe this summer to make a film with Sir Laurence Olivier.

Asked Wednesday whether he plans to marry Miss Monroe, the author of "Death of a Salesman" and "The Crucible" said he was unwilling to comment until after he obtains a divorce.

In Los Angeles, a spokesman for the actress said she has "no plans for marriage at this time."

Miller said from the Pyramid Lake Guest Ranch where he is working on a new play that he had planned to file for divorce Thursday from the former Mary Grace Slattery of New York.

He said his wife has not signed necessary papers because negotiations haven't been completed on a property agreement and custody of their two children. The couple married in 1940.

Death Penalty Probable In Peddling Of Heroin

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Senate Thursday passed and sent to the House a bill to allow the death penalty for the peddling of heroin, called the "slow death narcotic."

The bill, passed by a voice vote, would allow juries to impose the capital penalty for the sale of heroin to teen agers, or for a third conviction of sale of the drug to adults.

Also by voice vote, the Senate struck from the measure a provision which would have allowed wire tapping to obtain evidence against narcotics peddlers in general. It adopted instead a substitute provision providing severe prison sentences for the use of any "communications facility" in connection with the illicit traffic in drugs.
