Civil Defense Agency Goes On 24-Hour Alert
SALEM (AP) — The Oregon civil defense agency went on a 24-hour alert Friday because of the Columbia River flood.
Col. Arthur M. Sheets, state CD director, said the alert would be maintained until the emergency is past.
The state headquarters sent two 1,500 gallon per minute pumps to Portland in order to keep that city's sewage and garbage disposal systems operating if the flood should get worse.
Sheets and his staff inspected critical areas along the Columbia Friday.

Dun & Bradstreet Price Index Remains The Same
NEW YORK (AP) — The Dun & Bradstreet wholesale food price index for June remained the same as the previous week, although various foods shifted higher and lower.
For both last week and this week the index stood at \$6.11. A year ago it was \$6.33. The highest point reached by the index so far this year was \$6.14 two weeks ago.
The index comprises the total wholesale cost of one pound each of 31 foods in general use.

D'Ewart Wants Control Of Klamaths Extended
WASHINGTON (AP) — Asst. Secretary of the Interior Wesley A. D'Ewart said here today that he thinks federal control over Klamath Indians should not be terminated at this time as proposed in an amendment to public law 587. His statement followed a report to the department by T. B. Walters and Eugene G. Favell, management specialists who have been looking into the matter. Walters and Favell said the law would destroy "one of the finest stands of timber in the United States."

Russians Protest U. S. Fingerprint Requirements

MOSCOW (AP) — Nikita S. Khrushchev declared in a talk Thursday with Isaac Stern, Russian-born American violinist, that no Soviet citizens "will ever go to the United States if they have to be fingerprinted." He said Congress ought to change the law.
Premier Bulganin backed up the Communist Party boss.
"We will never submit to it," Bulganin said.
And Foreign Minister V. M. Molotov chimed in: "Never! Never!"
And protests against the U. S. Immigration requirement for fingerprinting of nonofficial foreign visitors were sounded over champagne glasses at a British Embassy garden party honoring the official birthday of 30-year-old Queen Elizabeth II.
Washington has skirted the requirement by permitting some small Russian delegations—among them farmers, churchmen and entertainers—to enter the United States with official status. But there may be a problem in the case of such large Soviet cultural groups as the Moiseyev folk dance ensemble, scheduled to leave for New York in the fall. U. S. Embassy sources said the Moiseyev troupe matter is being discussed within the State Department.
