SALEM — Oregon's traffic death toll in the first five months of this year is 147, or nine more than in the similar period of last year, the state Traffic Safety Division reported Wednesday. There were 25 deaths in May, compared with 33 in May 1955.

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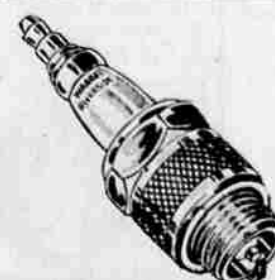
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
