Actress Fearful That Husband Is Carrying Gun

LOS ANGELES (AP) — Film actress Jeanne Crain says she has been told by friends that her estranged husband Paul Brinkman carries a gun and "if worst comes to worst he will use it."

The actress so informed a Superior Court judge yesterday as she petitioned the court to take away any guns in Brinkman's possession.

Her request was supported by an affidavit from a friend of the couple, Mrs. Marshall Kester, who said Brinkman told her in a recent conversation that he was despondent because Miss Crain seemed indifferent to his welfare.

"I told him that he was not the type to commit suicide," Mrs. Kester's statement said, "and he replied that he might and in that case he would take Jeanne with him."

The 30-year-old film star filed suit for divorce last March, charging cruelty, and filed an amended complaint May 16. In this she detailed accusations that he chased her around their home using cave-man tactics to show his affection, and beat her in front of their children.

Brinkman, 37, filed a cross complaint containing generalized accusations.

Roosevelt, Navy aircraft carrier. They will leave Wednesday, June 13, for Seattle, where the cruise will start. The carrier will take them through the Straits of Magellan after a tour down the coast of North and South America. They will sail up the eastern seaboard to Florida where they will be released Aug. 10 to return to Roseburg. They will stop at the chief ports on the route. This is the longest training type cruise scheduled in recent years for west coast men. All three men are members of the Naval Reserve Electronics Division 13-7 in Roseburg. Grange Reaffirms Strong Opposition To Sales Tax

PENDLETON (AP) — The Oregon State Grange Thursday reaffirmed its historic opposition to a sales tax by rejecting almost unanimously three resolutions calling for such a levy to support schools.

Another resolution opposed any further increase in freight rates, particularly for farm products. This one was approved.

James T. Marr, executive secretary of the Oregon State Federation of Labor, told the delegates that falling farm prices, not rising wages of industrial work-

ers, were responsible for the farm problem. He said that Secretary of Agriculture Benson had just-

ly accused the American labor movement of being a major factor in the problem.

BILL HITS SNAG — The city's ban on pinball games ran into at least a temporary delay Wednesday because the owner of a shop selling toys for babies said it would apply to her shop and it wasn't supposed to.

Circuit Judge Alfred P. Dobson issued a temporary restraining order and set June 14 for a hearing.

Floyd Root, Wasco County wheat grower, said in a panel discussion on wheat that if the "domestic parity" plan were adopted, increased feed, export and food markets would soon absorb the wheat surplus and this would make acreage restrictions no longer necessary.
