

Local Trapshooters Enter Salem Scattergun Tourney

Several Douglas County trapshooters are heading for Salem to take part in the richest Oregon State Trapshoot Tournament in history this weekend. Better than \$8,000 in cash and trophies will be won in the three-day shoot.

The meet is scheduled to start Friday, winding up Sunday afternoon, and will be held on the Salem Gun Club range, located southeast of the city.

The Oregon class championships for AA, A, B, C and D shooters will be the big item Friday. This event will be one of 200 targets at 16 yards. The Oregon doubles, deciding the state championship, runnerup and Class A, B and C titles, will be a Friday afternoon feature.

The first half of the Oregon singles championship, along with the governor's handicap (which is a preliminary handicap) will come off Saturday. The second half of the Oregon singles will be shot off Sunday, along with the "main event" of the tournament, the Oregon state handicap.

Douglas gunners will be headed by Gordon Miller, a past member of the All-American championship trap team from Drain and Harry Lupton, another standout shooter from that city.

Lila McMullen, 1955 national trapshoot queen from Roseburg, and Donna Woolley from Drain will lead Douglas County ladies to the firing lines.

Others from the area who are slated for action are Ken Gilkeson, Bill Jones, Ivan Pickett, Dick DeBernardi, Forrest Solomon, Ken Elliott, Bob McMullen, Ken Elliott, Red Byrd, Dean Bubar and Ted Rice, all of Roseburg, and Henry Shirliff from Myrtle Creek.

Now that Kansas City Manager Lou Boudreau has Mickey Mantle "figured out," what's he going to do about Yogi Berra?

Berra, a bad ball, spray hitter, hit his 18th homer and fourth in four games — to get the Yankees rolling on a 9-1 decision over the A's Thursday. He added two singles and drove in two runs — giving him six homers, 10 RBIs and a .545 average in six games against the A's this year.

The victory pushed New York into a 4½-game lead as runner-up Cleveland was dumped by Baltimore 5-2. The Chicago White Sox beat Washington 7-5 and Boston trimmed Detroit 6-5 in 10 innings.

Cincinnati's rugged Redlegs boomed into the National League lead by a half-game over the St. Louis Cardinals.

While the Chicago Cubs dropped Pittsburgh to third 5-2, Milwaukee closed Brooklyn's winning streak at four games as Bob Buhl pitched a four-hitter to win 4-1.

Hank Bauer hit his 13th homer for the Yankees, knocking in his 34th run — not bad for a guy hitting .203.

The A's didn't shift against Mantle — hitting right-handed by loser Alex Kellner — and he had two-for-four. Bob Turley won it for a 3-2 record.

The Redlegs moved into the NL lead for the first time in 12 years.

At this late stage in the season by clipping losing reliever Bob Miller for three runs in the eighth.

SANGER, Calif. (AP) — Duke's record breaking sprinter, Dave Sime, who professes a liking for clay tracks, gets a crack at one of the best Saturday night in the Central California Assn. AAU track and field championships.
