All four teams are pulling out their top-drawer pitchers with Seattle putting the heat on the wavering Angels for first place.

The Rainiers were 3½ games behind a week ago and the Angels were solidly on top. In that week the Rainiers hung up a 6-2 mark against San Francisco and Sacramento, while the Angels got only 3-5 against Sacramento and San Diego.

The match at Seattle brings together San Francisco's top hurler, Jerry Casale 7-3, against Bud Podbielan 6-1. Los Angeles is coming up with Dave Hillman 5-1 against Bob Darnell 5-2.

Repatriated GIs Mostly Enemy

WASHINGTON (AP) — Eighty per cent of the American war prisoners repatriated after the Korean War neither resisted nor cooperated with their Communist captors, an Army research study shows. Based on analysis of the records of the 3,323 former prisoners, the study classified 15 per cent as collaborators and the remaining 5 per cent as resisters. The study did not take into account the actions of more than 3,000 others who died in captivity. Those who did cooperate with their captors, the study showed, did so primarily not because of any belief in communism but to avoid possible mistreatment and to obtain preferential treatment. There was little difference in the backgrounds of the resisters and the participants, said the study. The latter group, it added, "came back in physically better shape," but the resisters had "fewer neurotic symptoms."
