Britain Departs Another High Greek Clergyman

LONDON (AP) — Britain departed another high Greek clergyman Tuesday in the continuing tumult over Cyprus.
Three months after Archbishop Makarios III was exiled from the British Mediterranean colony as the leader of a union-with-Greece movement, Scotland Yard closed in on Archimandrite Kallinikos Macheriotis, whose London congregation includes several thousand Cypriots of Greek blood.
Home Secretary Gwilym Lloyd George ordered the deportation of the archimandrite, whose rank is about that of a dean in the Anglican church, in what a spokesman called "the public interest."
A Greek national who was born in Cyprus, the clergyman was picked up at his home and escorted by detectives aboard a regular airliner which left for Athens at 2:45 a.m.
He was flown out as Nicos Kranidiotis, a top aide of Archbishop Makarios, flew to London for talks with British officials—foes of Prime Minister Eden's Cyprus policy—and to speak at public meetings. The archbishop is quartered in exile on the Seychelles Islands in the Indian Ocean.
In Cyprus, there was another death sentence Tuesday.
A Nicosia court condemned Stelios Mavromatis, 23, to the gallows for shooting at two British airmen. He pleaded innocent and presumably will appeal.
British military operations on Cyprus were highlighted Tuesday by the imposition of a curfew on Lakatamia, a predominantly Communist village of about 3,000 population about eight miles from Nicosia, the capital.
Minesweeping teams and a special search squad combed houses and yards for weapons and ammunition.
British authorities last May 10 handed two pro-Greek Cypriots for political shootings in the struggle to end British rule of Cyprus and unite the Mediterranean island with Greece. The pro-Greek Cypriot underground claimed the following day that it had hanged two British soldiers in reprisal for the executions.

Playwright Mum On Plans To Wed
NEW YORK (AP) — Playwright Arthur Miller, who received a divorce from his wife of 15 years in Reno Monday arrived here Tuesday still declining to say whether he will wed screen star Marilyn Monroe.
Asked whether he would see Miss Monroe while here, Miller replied: "Oh, that may happen one of these days."
Miss Monroe, now here preparing for a trip to London, also has declined to say whether she and the 41-year-old dramatist are planning to marry but have said they are "very good friends."
While at Reno awaiting his divorce from the former Mary Grace Slatery of New York, the playwright was served with a subpoena to appear before the House Un-American Activities Committee in Washington. Miller requested and obtained a postponement until June 21.
He reiterated he doesn't have any idea why he has been summoned, and said he'd never been subpoenaed before.

Colleges Cite Low Salaries For Teachers

PORTLAND (AP) — Competing with industry wage scales is beyond the reach of the state Board of Higher Education, a spokesman said Monday in answer to appeals from college teachers for immediate pay increases.
The board, which continued its meeting Tuesday, heard a plea from a salary committee of the state system's American Assn. of University Professors. The committee said wages must be increased or the state will have to resign itself to sub-standard teaching personnel in the state colleges.
The teachers recommended a 20 per cent average increase for inclusion in the biennial budget to come before the Legislature at the 1957 session.
Resignations on college staffs have increased in the past year, the committee said. It cited the case of a Portland State College teacher who left a \$4,000-a-year position to join the Portland public school system at \$5,800 a year.
Allosh Popovich, assistant dean of the engineering school at Oregon State College, acted as spokesman for the professors' association. He said the major need is salary raises for professors with long experience.
Herman Oliver, acting chairman of the state board's finance committee, said the board is aware of the need to compete with other institutions for teachers. But he added "we cannot compete with industry."
Appointment of two top officials in the state System of Higher Education came before the board for confirmation Tuesday. Philip G. Hoffman, dean of the general extension division, is to become dean of faculty at Portland State College. J. W. Sherburne, head of the Oregon State College psychology department, is to succeed Hoffman.
