

Henry Wolf Files For Dillard Board

Henry N. Wolf of Winston is one of five candidates for a vacancy in the Dillard school board. The five-year post will be filled Monday when voters cast their ballots in the annual school election.

Wolf, 63, came to Douglas County in 1930 from DeQueen, Ark., where he had owned and operated a sawmill. Wednesday, he told the News-Review he got his first experience working in school affairs when he served as a school board director in DeQueen.

He has been employed in the lumber industry in central Douglas County, and last year served as a custodian at Douglas High School. Wolf believes a 11 school board members should serve a year as a school custodian.

"They'd know then what it takes to maintain the school and keep discipline," he said.

Wolf says he had another brush with school matters early in the 1950s when he returned to the mid-west and lived in Eagletown, Okla. He had gone there with his wife, Demie, to stay with her mother who was ill. As a citizen, he said he worked to help solve a school financial problem in Eagletown.

Candidate Wolf and his wife live on Gregory street. They have three children, all living in Winston. Mrs. George Clark, Mrs. Edith Richardson and Wilton T. Wolf. Wolf is a member of the Oregon School Employees Assn.

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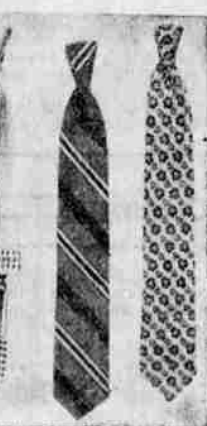

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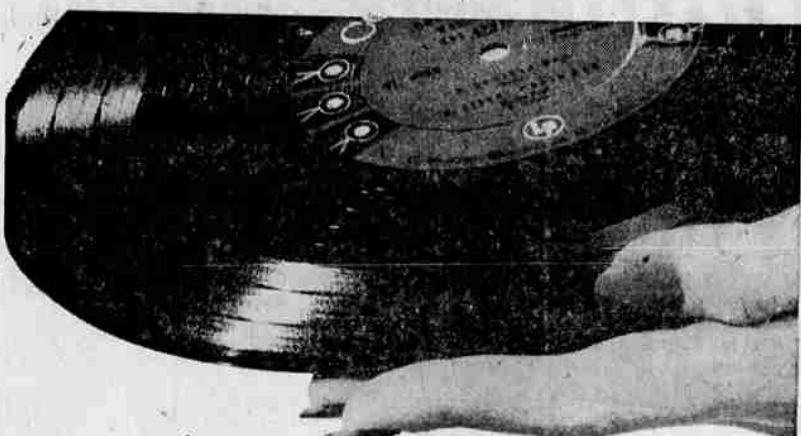
