Floor baskets holding white gladioli and pink snapdragons flanked the candelabra holding tall white candles. Arrangements of white roses centered the church windows, while the choir box was outlined with evergreens and syringa. Mrs. C. A. Ricketts, assisted by Mrs. Jack Chapman, had charge of the decorations for the church and reception.

Mrs. Paul Geddes played the wedding music including the traditional processional "Bridal Chorus" from Lohengrin and Mendelssohn's recessional and accompanied her daughter, Miss Gayle, who sang, "Because" and "I Love Thee."
