Remain Stronger, Advises Adenauer

CHICAGO — Chancellor Adenauer of West Germany declared Friday the "supreme need facing the free world" is to remain stronger than the Soviet Union. The 80-year-old European leader cautioned the free world against being lulled into a sense of false security by recent changes in Russian behavior. Dr. Adenauer, speaking through an interpreter, told the Executive Club of Chicago that the Soviet aim of world domination remains unchanged.

"The hot war has been avoided through timely rearmament of the free peoples. The cold war will end in our favor if we are wise and patient," he declared. Adenauer said the Russians "have an attitude toward time and the passing of time which differs from that of the United States and of the free peoples, especially the Europeans."

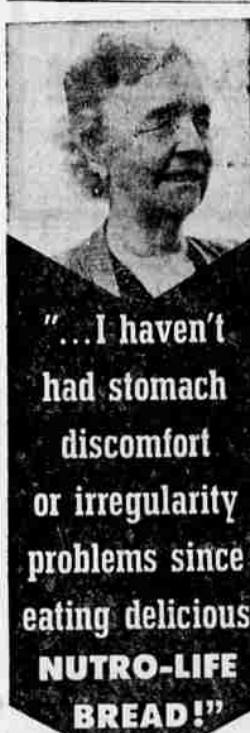
