Umpqua Timber Draws 2 Bidders

A sale of Umpqua Forest timber Wednesday at Roseburg on a 70-acre tract about 46 miles east of Roseburg drew two bidders. Total volume of the sale was 5,800,000 board feet. It was appraised at \$141,825. A total volume of 4,350,000 feet of Douglas fir was appraised at \$23.25 per thousand. Also included was one million board feet of western hemlock and other species appraised at \$7.50. Some 250,000 board feet of western white pine was appraised at \$28.35.

High bidder in the sale Wednesday was Douglas Vener Co. of Roseburg. It bid \$141,825, just \$50 over the total appraisal. The bid was \$7.55 per thousand for hemlock and the appraised prices on Douglas fir and pine.

One other company bid. It was Western Battery Separator Co. of Roseburg. Meanwhile, a small salvage sale this week was reported from the Bohemia Ranger District. It was located on 15 acres about 32 miles southeast of Cottage Grove. The timber was beetle killed and blow-down. Total volume of 350,000 board feet was appraised at \$7.75. Some 300,000 board feet of Douglas fir and pine was appraised at \$24.25. Fifty thousand board feet of hemlock and other species were appraised at \$10 per thousand.

High bidder was R. R. Tuttle of McKenzie Bridge, Ore. He bid \$8,225. Other bidders were Myron E. Yearous of Cottage Grove and Potter Lumber Co. of Cottage Grove. Tuttle's bid was \$25.75 for Douglas fir and pine and appraised prices for other species.

H. Brubaker Files Suit For Auto Accident Injury
Harry A. Brubaker has filed suit in Douglas County Circuit Court against Carolyn Peden for \$30,000 general and \$3,850 special damages for injuries he says he received in a two-car accident last July. In the complaint he says he was going south on Southeast Stephens Street and had stopped his car in a line of traffic near the intersection with Roberts Avenue. He claims the car driven by the defendant slammed into the rear of his car causing "whiplash" injuries to his back and neck. Besides the general damages, Brubaker asks \$3,150 for loss of earnings and \$500 medical, surgical and hospital expenses as the result of the accident.
