Portlander Dies As Planes Crash

SEATTLE (AP) — A prominent Portland, Ore., businessman, a flying instructor and his student were killed Thursday in the collision of two small planes.

Mark Peter Miller, 31, president of the Terminal Flour Mills Co., of Portland and the Spokane Flour Mills Co., was identified by the coroner's office as one of the victims several hours after the 9:30 a. m. crash.

The other two men killed were Calvin W. Boyle, 32, a flying instructor and the father of four children, and Ellis Clark, 44, both of Seattle. Clark had been taking flying lessons several months and only recently soloed.

The three victims were thrown from the planes after the crash, which occurred as they neared Boeing Field, apparently for landings. Wreckage fell on and near several homes and one of them burned.

One witness, Aveluy Coffey, said he saw one plane ram the other in the side and it sounded "like a cannon going off."

Runaway Trailer Hits Car, Woman Is Killed

PENDLETON (AP) — A trailer loaded with wheat ripped loose from a careening truck on a mountain road Thursday and crashed into a car carrying a Seattle family on holiday. The mother was killed and the father and four children hospitalized.

The victim was Mrs. Herbert Gregg Carpenter, 33. Her husband Herbert, 47, was at the wheel of their eastbound car and in the instant of horror before the crash had no chance to turn out of the trailer's path.

Hundreds of bushels of wheat were strewn over Highway 30 as the trailer overturned and crashed into the car on a sweeping curve on Emigrant Hill only a little way from where three men died June 9 in a car-truck crash.

Labor Council Wants Commissioner Elected

PORTLAND (AP) — The Oregon State Labor Council, AFL-CIO, proposed Wednesday that the state utilities commission be elected hereafter. The office now is an appointive one.

The council, organized two days ago by state merger of the AFL and CIO unions, also passed a resolution advocating that 18-year-olds be allowed to vote in Oregon. Still another resolution proposed a uniform state building code. Several speakers told delegates that labor must keep public relations in mind and that labor leaders must face up to their public responsibilities.
