Lower Price Tags On Pork, Lamb Billed This Week

Weekend shoppers will find lower price tags on pork and lamb in most food stores across the country this week. A continued drop in the wholesale market indicates even further price cuts are in the offing.

Meat specials for the weekend vary widely throughout the country, reflecting local supplies and tastes. But in general housewives will find the mainstay of week-end special lists are ground chuck and other standard beef cuts, veal and lamb.

Salad greens, spring onions, radishes, spinach and cabbage make up the best buy generally available at vegetable counters.

Good buys in vegetable include beans, beets and squash. The asparagus season is tapering off and cuttings vary widely in quality and condition.

A wide variety of early summer fruits is now available from southern and western orchards. Prices are still high.

Court Of Appeals Upholds Charge Against Flaxer

WASHINGTON — The U. S. Court of Appeals Thursday upheld the contempt conviction of Abram Flaxer, president of a government workers' union, for refusing to produce membership lists demanded by a Senate committee.

Flaxer, of New York, was president of the United Public Workers, a union made up of employees of federal, state and local governments.

The Senate Internal Security subcommittee demanded that Flaxer produce Oct. 3, 1951 membership lists divided between those employed by the federal government and other governmental units. He was charged with contempt when he refused.

Flaxer was convicted in March, 1952. He was fined \$1,000 and sentenced to two months in jail. He has been free on bond pending outcome of his appeal.

Film Producer Files Suit For Big Damages

BEND — Floyd Frigen, a film producer from Hollywood, Calif., is suing a Bend corporation for \$105,000 damages in a dispute over a film that wasn't produced.

Frigen said that Ida Mae Faris, Alva C. Goodrich and Philip Gould, all of Bend and members of the corporation, broke a contract with him. He said the contract called for them to provide money for production of a film to be named, "The Monsters."

The film was to have been produced in the Lava River Caves, south of Bend, he said.

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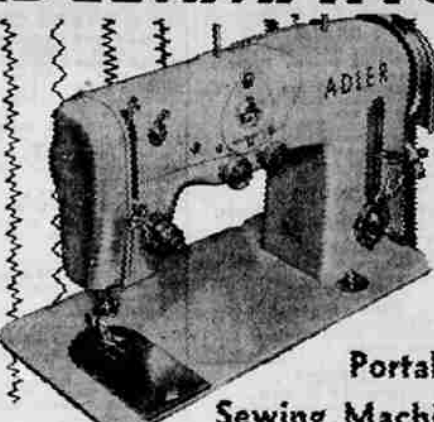
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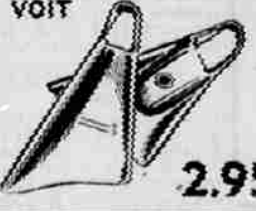
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
