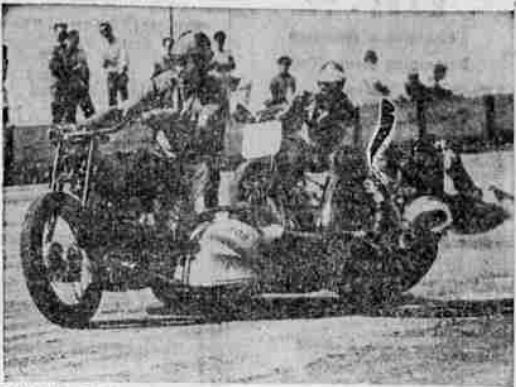

The combined Motor Olympics and Bill McGraw's Tournament of Thrills will make an initial appearance in Roseburg tonight at the fairgrounds.

The combined show features automobiles and motorcycles racing plus 28 exciting stunts by the racing daredevils from Bill McGraw's troupe.

The show is touring the country with all profits going to the United States Olympic Fund to send U.S. athletes to the 1956 Olympics in Melbourne, Australia.

Teams from England, Australia, Mexico, Germany, Sweden, Columbia, S.A. and the United States will compete in a variety of events with one of the most dangerous being side-car motorcycle racing.

The Tournament of Thrills features crashing cars off ramps at high speed, through flaming walls, and rolling them over.

Crowns will be on hand to keep the youngsters entertained and Big Bill, the motorized elephant will be on hand to give kiddies who arrive early, a free ride.

The show will get under way at 8:30 p.m.

Olympic Tryouts Draw Top Stars

LOS ANGELES (AP) — An amazing collection of track and field athletes compete here tomorrow and Saturday for places on the United States Olympic team, and in no less than 13 of the 17 events, competitors have bettered or equaled the Olympic records.

In some instances, the competition here could be even tougher than at the games at Melbourne, Australia, in the fall. Take the pole vault. The Olympic record is 14 feet 11 1/2 inches set by the Rev. Bob Richards in 1932. Four vaulters in the trials, including Richards, have cleared 15 feet this year. The others are Don Bragg of Villanova, Ron Gutowski of Occidental and Bob Morris of Southern California. Only three can make the team.

Even stiffer competition comes in the 800-meter run and the 110-meter high hurdles. In both, competitors who might beat the best of all the other nations might not be fast enough to make Uncle Sam's team.

The Boston Red Sox were only three games off the American League lead last Sept. 8.

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
