

Former Resident Of County Bicycling From Los Angeles

A former Myrtle Creek resident and her 14-year-old son have embarked on a bicycle trip which will take them eventually from Los Angeles, Calif., to central Canada.

The cycle enthusiasts are Mrs. Lucile Galven and her son Richard. Mrs. Galven is the daughter of Mrs. Ruth Kistler of Myrtle Creek.

They left Los Angeles last week and when last heard from were leaving Atascadero, Calif. Mrs. Galven is keeping her mother notified of progress by post card. Atascadero is located on Highway 101, and is approximately the halfway point between Los Angeles and San Francisco, Mrs. Kistler said.

The 34-year-old widow made the trip to lose weight, according to her mother. She hopes the exercise will do the trick and has always been a bicycle fan. A third member of the traveling family is "Puzzy," an eight-year-old Chihuahua. The dog rides in a basket attached to the rear fender of Lucile's bike.

Mrs. Kistler first learned of her daughter's plan to cycle up the west coast last Christmas. She had gone to visit her and was invited to accompany the safari. As Mrs. Kistler explained her answer Thursday "I tried bike riding, but my legs wouldn't take it." She said she practiced at the home she and her husband Samuel own, but wasn't very successful.

The trip by bike should bring Mrs. Galven and her boy to Myrtle Creek in another month, her mother believes. They average about 15 miles per day on their three-year mounts. Mrs. Galven lived in the southern Douglas town from 1947-49 with her mother and stepfather. Her husband Charles was killed in

France during World War II. The trip north by the masseuse, who works privately in the Los Angeles area, has attracted lots of attention. Mrs. Kistler receives clippings from papers along the route almost daily. Many come from strangers who know she is interested in the trip's progress.

The exact termination date of the trip wasn't known by Mrs. Kistler, but she noted it would have to end in time for young Richard to return to school the second week of September.

Why was her daughter making the more than 90 mile trip along the coastal route, rather than coming inland? "She was afraid she couldn't make the Siskiyou's," Mrs. Kistler concluded.

Contract Granted For Yoncalla City Street Paving

A \$15,403.50 contract for paving 2 1/2 miles of Hayhurst Road in Yoncalla was awarded Friday by the State Highway Commission to Roseburg Paving Co.

Meanwhile, four contracts for other projects in Douglas County will be let after bids are opened by the commission at its July 12 and 13 meeting in Portland.

They are:

- Roadside improvement of the Garden Valley Road interchange on the relocated Pacific Highway near Roseburg.
- Drainage improvement of Sherman Street-Pine Street section of Elkton-Sutherland Highway in Sutherland.
- Construction of steel and timber pier protection on Umpqua River Bridge at Reedsport.
- Construction of a latrine at Umpqua Lighthouse State Park five miles south of Reedsport.

Also to be opened among the two million dollars worth of highway projects is paving and sealing of 14.1 miles and oiling of 17 miles of the Goshen-Cottage Grove section of the Pacific Highway.

French Launch Air, Sea Attack, Kill 300 Rebels

ALGERIERS, Algeria (AP) — Unofficial sources said French forces launched an attack from the sea and land against rebels in north-east Algeria Friday and killed or captured 300 nationalists.

The office of Robert Lacost, French minister, however, deplored what he called "sensational" accounts of the operation, saying they tended to give the actions of the French forces "the form of a war of extermination."

French army headquarters also said the report that 300 rebels had been captured or killed was inaccurate. It refused to give any casualty figures.

The correspondent of the Paris newspaper France Soir said 10,000 French soldiers were engaged in the operation to clean out the Collo Mountain area where rebels have been in virtual control for more than a year.

Jeanne Crain Denies Alleged Misconduct

LOS ANGELES (AP) — Jeanne Crain says she kissed a manufacturer neighbor "just once" — on his birthday, when his wife and her husband were present — and was alone with him twice in an apartment. But she says she "certainly did not" ever engage in misconduct with the neighbor, as alleged by her husband.

The 30-year-old film star made her statements in a 66-page deposition taken last Friday in the office of her husband's attorney and filed yesterday in Superior Court.

The actress' estranged husband Paul Brinkman, 37, recently filed a cross-complaint for divorce in which he accused her of infidelities on several occasions in the past two years with Homer Rhoads. Miss Crain and Rhoads, 45, president of an aircraft equipment firm, immediately issued denials.

The kiss occurred on Rhoads' birthday last September, in his home with his wife Hilda and Brinkman present, Miss Crain said in the deposition.

She said also she was alone with Rhoads on two occasions in a North Hollywood apartment which she "understood" was his secretary's. But nothing improper occurred, she declared.

"It was a conversation about his drinking," she testified. "He and his wife were having trouble. They are both very good friends of ours. They weren't happy and felt that we were successfully and happily married."

Oil Barge Blows Up In San Francisco Bay

SAN FRANCISCO (AP) — An oil barge blew up Thursday night, hurling two crew men into the water and spreading a fierce fire along a pier. Both men, badly burned, were rescued.

Two fire boats and dozens of fire department pieces quickly controlled the dangerous blaze on the San Francisco waterfront at Mariposa Street.

"It blew up in three quick blasts," said John de Haan, 49, crewman on the Navy oiler Kern, anchored nearby.

He said the Tidewater Associated Oil Co. barge was unloading fuel oil.

President Will Leave Hospital On Saturday

WASHINGTON (AP) — President Eisenhower plans to check out of Walter Reed Army Hospital at about 8:30 a.m. Saturday. He intends to convalesce for "at least two weeks" at his Gettysburg, Pa., farm.

Announcing this Friday, the White House said Eisenhower would be accompanied on the 85-mile drive to his country home by Mrs. Eisenhower, his personal physician, Maj. Gen. Howard M. Snyder, and "two house guests" for the weekend, Maj. Gen. and Mrs. Leonard D. Heaton.

Heaton, the Walter Reed commandant, operated on the President three weeks ago Saturday for relief of a partial blockage of the small intestine.

James C. Hagerty, White House press secretary, said the Heaton will be celebrating their 30th wedding anniversary Saturday.

The President and Mrs. Eisenhower will observe their 40th anniversary at the family farm on Sunday.

Preparing to check out, the President planned to step up his physical activity by going up and down a few stairs some time Friday. That would prepare him for descent of about a half-dozen stairs when he leaves the hospital to enter his limousine.

The president arranged to confer at the hospital during the afternoon with Vice President Nixon on Nixon's forthcoming visits to the Philippines and to Vietnam.

Eisenhower, Hagerty said, plans to give Nixon personal messages for President Ramon Magasaysay of the Philippines and President Ngo Dinh Diem of Vietnam.

strators and even gave up their arms to them. Some of the marchers were well armed, and returned the fire of troops. They succeeded at one time in capturing some of the tanks.

There were persistent rumors of other uprisings in the cities of Szczecin (Stettin), Gdansk, Gdynia, Allenstein (olszyn), Katowice and Lodz, but Warsaw Radio mentioned only the events at Poznan, at least 30,000 persons were reported in the marching, milling crowds which started the demonstration by upsetting cars.

by every honorable means. It is not our objective to over-arm or alarm."

Of this country's military strength now and for the future, Wilson said it is "a dynamic military power of true substance."

"We do not need or wish to flaunt it before the world," he added, "but it would be a serious disservice to our country and the morale of the free world to belittle it."

Wilson prepared his testimony for a public hearing by the Senate Armed Services subcommittee which has been looking into the relative strength of U.S. and Russian air power.

After reading his statement in the jam-packed hearing room, Wilson declared under questioning that President Eisenhower has never dictated specific ceilings or cuts in military spending.

"The President never told me you've got to cut your military budget so much, never in 3 1/2 years," Wilson said.

Lear Returns After Flying Plane To Russia

MOSCOW (AP) — William P. Lear, U.S. plane equipment manufacturer whose flying trip to the Soviet capital stirred up an international fuss, departed Friday for Berlin aboard his private plane. His wife accompanied him.

Lear was summoned to the U.S. embassy Thursday night for a talk with Minister Walter Walmsley. Lear declined afterward to discuss what was said.

Another American flying visitor in Moscow is Gen. Nathan B. Twining, U.S. Air Force chief of staff, who visited an atomic power station Friday. He toured a 5000-kilowatt station which has become a showplace since it began operating in June 1954. It feeds Moscow a minute part of its electrical supply.

Malwaukie Box, Veneer Plant Suffers Loss

MILWAUKIE, Ore. (AP) — The Malwaukie Box and Veneer Co. plant suffered loss estimated at \$50,000 from a fire Thursday night.

The blaze destroyed a dry kiln filled with 32 loads of veneer. The company's stitching room and equipment in it also were destroyed.
