Home from a disastrous road trip, Eugene takes on Yakima Friday night in a showdown that could point to the Northwest Baseball League's "first half" champion.

And the Emeralds will need to sweep the four-game weekend series at Eugene just to pull even with the Bears.

After a drive that carried them to within 1 1/2 games of the front-runners, Eugene slumped badly on the road, losing five out of eight in visits at Spokane and Tri-City.

The weekend showdown is one of two before the league hands a pennant to the "first half" winner. The Emeralds will get another crack at the Bears in a four-game stand ending July 8, the day the loop splits the season to give its seven members a fresh start.

Yakima snapped a winning string and Eugene a losing streak in Thursday night's round of activities.

Salem ended Yakima's skein at eight straight (including four over Salem) in a 3-2 squeaker at Yakima. Eugene took its first win in four starts at Tri-City, 6-5.

Wenatchee beat Lewiston, 8-6, in a seesaw affair at Lewiston. Spokane was not scheduled.
