### Courthouse Has New Telephone Number Listing

The Douglas County Courthouse in Roseburg has a new telephone number. It is OR 2-3311.

Pacific Telephone and Telegraph Co. Manager D. E. Lafferty says the new number should eliminate delays experienced by courthouse callers.

He explained that the old number (OR 3-5562) was given out when the courthouse switchboard went in. At that time, the telephone company was short on consecutive numbers to give to customers, so they gave the old number, a few consecutive numbers that followed it and some "wildcat" listings.

The temporary measure worked, but not always well. Lafferty said his men had made a count and learned that as many as 200 to 300 phoned had received a busy signal from the courthouse in a single day.

As soon as possible, the phone company gave the county headquarters eight new consecutive numbers, starting with OR 2-3311. The system is so rigged that a new number, OR 2-3314 for example, will be automatically selected, if the first number is busy. Lafferty pointed out that phoners won't have to redial.

He said there would be a period of transition. Currently, the telephone company is working to alleviate it. When a person rings the old courthouse number, his call is switched to an interceptor operator, who informs him of the change. Lafferty said the numbers now in use have never been used in Roseburg before.
