

Top-Seeded Lew Hoad Set To Meet Rosewall In Final

WIMBLEDON, England (AP) — Top-seeded Lew Hoad of Australia, spotted Ham Richardson of Westfield, N.J., the first set then came on to win, 3-6, 6-4, 6-2, 6-4, in Wimbledon tennis championships. Hoad will meet Ken Rosewall, second-seeded Australian, in the final Friday.

WIMBLEDON, England (AP) — Shirley Fry of St. Petersburg, Fla., the fifth-seeded player, eliminated defending champion Louise Brough of Beverly Hills, Calif., Thursday, 6-4, 4-6, 6-3, in the biggest women's upset of the Wimbledon Tennis Tournament to go into the finals. Miss Fry will meet Britain's Angela Buxton for the championship Saturday.

The match and rain caused a nine-minute delay during the second set.

Richardson's game came apart in the third set and the big, blond Australian ran out the match almost casually.

Hoad, a rather slow starter, was erratic in the first set. He netted twice in the seventh game, losing his own service, and then double-faulted three times in the ninth game. During the remainder of the match he played beautiful tennis.

WIMBLEDON, England (AP) — Australia's second best tennis player, Ken Rosewall, has defeated America's best player, Vic Seixas, nine times in 10 matches.

That gives you an idea just how dark America's hopes are for bringing home the Davis Cup because Rosewall and Seixas are mostly likely to meet next in the Davis Cup challenge round in Adelaide between Dec. 26 and 28.

Their tenth meeting was late Wednesday afternoon on the center court of the 70th Wimbledon championships. Their match was a semifinal. Rosewall pulled out the victory with a comeback as fine as any seen here this year. The scores were 6-3, 3-4, 6-5, 6-3, 7-5, in a long rain-interrupted match.

At the finish Seixas showed a fit of temper, probably in utter disgust with himself.

He threw down his racket, refused to thank the officials, and would not go to the net to congratulate Rosewall and finally was consoled by Rosewall.

The crowd of 13,000, which had been very much for Seixas, turned on him. He was booed off the center court, something which has not befallen many players.

Comments heard after the match ranged from "grotesque behavior" to "bad show."

Thronburg, Hubbard Snare Victories In Cycle Races

Don Thronburg of Roseburg and a former Roseburg man, Don Hubbard, now of Coos Bay, claimed top honors at a motorcycle racing tournament at the club's new track south of Roseburg Wednesday.

Thronburg took top honors in the B main event, and was followed home by Dick Russell of Winston. Hubbard captured the A main. Jerry Jones and Tom Bentley of Roseburg were second and third, respectively.

In the A main, Jones and Bentley battled with Hubbard down to the finish line. Bentley had earlier scored the fastest time of the day on the track. Louis Duquette made the second fastest time, but he took a rolling tumble to smash up his new cycle.

Winners were Thronburg, Jones and Bentley in the three heats.

In scoring his lap time, Thronburg took a sliding, rolling spill

on the south turn and after that almost spun out on the north turn. Spinouts were common occurrences in other events of the day as well. In the A main, Bentley was making a bid for first place when he went spinning on the north turn. He managed to get back in the race, however, and run home third.

Jones was holding first place in the A main when he went into a spin on the south turn. He re-entered to come home second.

Bentley was presented the Road-Runners dunce-eggball hat for being the last one to take a tumble.

Trout Angling Expected Good In The Umpqua

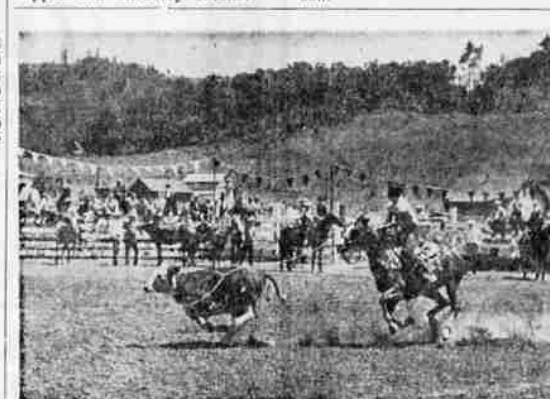
PORTLAND (AP) — Oregon's streams and lakes should provide generally fair to good fishing this weekend, the state Game Commission reported Thursday.

Northwest
Coast streams are low and clear and trout angling is fair in larger streams. Silver salmon angling is fair off the mouth of the Columbia when weather and water are favorable. Sand bar angling for steelhead, chinook and jacks is fair at Westport and Rainier.

Trout fishing is spotty in the Tillamook, Nestucca and Salmon rivers. In all Lincoln County streams trout angling is fair. A few bluebacks have been taken in tidalwater areas. On the McKenzie and Willamette rivers and their tributaries fishing has been fair to good from the bank, and the main Willamette and McKenzie have been good from boats. Lookout Point is fair for 9 and 10 inch trout from the bank and good on troll. Dorena is fair and so is Clear Creek.

Southwest
Trout angling is good on the North Umpqua, South Umpqua and Little rivers. The North Umpqua is very good with large wet flies and dark patterns producing best. The fast water areas of the upper main Umpqua are holding many shad but few anglers have gone after them.

Salmon fishing is fair to good in Coos Bay with early morning tides best. Striped bass angling also is fair to good but trout angling in the Coos and Coquille rivers and their tributaries is only fair. Trout and salmon fishing in all south coastal waters is very slow, though trout fishing remains good in nearly all waters of the Rogue watershed. Hot spots are the Union Creek area and the upper Rogue from Shady Cove to Peyton bridge. Good catches continue on the upper Applegate near Copper and Carberry creeks.

Portland divided an Independence Day baseball doubleheader with Hollywood before the Pacific Coast League's biggest crowd of the day as the two teams continued their fight for third and fourth places.

Second place Los Angeles also divided with San Diego but first place Seattle won both of its holiday games with Vancouver. It was 9-3 for Portland in the first game and 3-2 for Hollywood in the second. Los Angeles won, 6-1, after losing 12-14.

Seattle's victories were 9-8 and 2-0. San Francisco, loser of 10 in 11 games, finally came through with a pair of wins over Sacramento, 6-5 in 13 innings, and 7-4.

Portland's July 4 crowd was 9,785 paid, just five customers short of 10,000 this year with the season one game beyond the halfway mark. Next high Wednesday was the 9,027 at Los Angeles.

In the first game Portland and Hollywood were tied 1-1 going into the bottom of the sixth. Then Portland started going in front, touched off by Eddie Basinski's single, Luis Marquez' single and Basinski's break for the plate when Marquez got boxed. A bad throw left both of them safe and Marquez scored on Sam Calderone's single. Two more in the seventh and four in the eighth.

Portland's Bob Darnell held Hollywood to five hits and slammed out a homer himself with two on.

The second game was 1-0 for Portland in the early stages but in the sixth a single by Hollywood pitcher Ben Wade started trouble for Dick Fiedler. Two more singles and an intentional walk scored Wade and left the

basis full. Another walk gave Hollywood the lead, 2-1.

Ray Shore came in then but before he ended things with a strike-out a long flyout added a third run.

Los Angeles' Steve Bilko hit three homers to put his season total at 36.
