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Some Illnesses Not Polio Cases, Department Says

WASHINGTON (AP)—The Public Health Service said Tuesday a third of the cases diagnosed as infantile paralysis in last year's great outbreak may have been caused by a strange virus against which "the Salk vaccine probably has no effect."

Dr. Theodore J. Bauer, the service's top communicable diseases expert, urged the Senate Appropriations Committee to approve a supplemental \$480,000 appropriation for further research. He said it is "a major problem" which could not have been foreseen earlier.

"Recently analysis of reports and laboratory tests have disclosed," Bauer said, "that a great many of the (nearly 30,000) cases reported in 1955 by practicing physicians and state health departments as poliomyelitis could not be identified in the laboratories as poliomyelitis."

"In all reported poliomyelitic cases (paralytic and nonparalytic) about one-third could not be confirmed by laboratory tests."

Bauer said "Many other types of viruses" were found by the laboratory research, "most of which are not properly identified or evaluated as to their effects upon humans."

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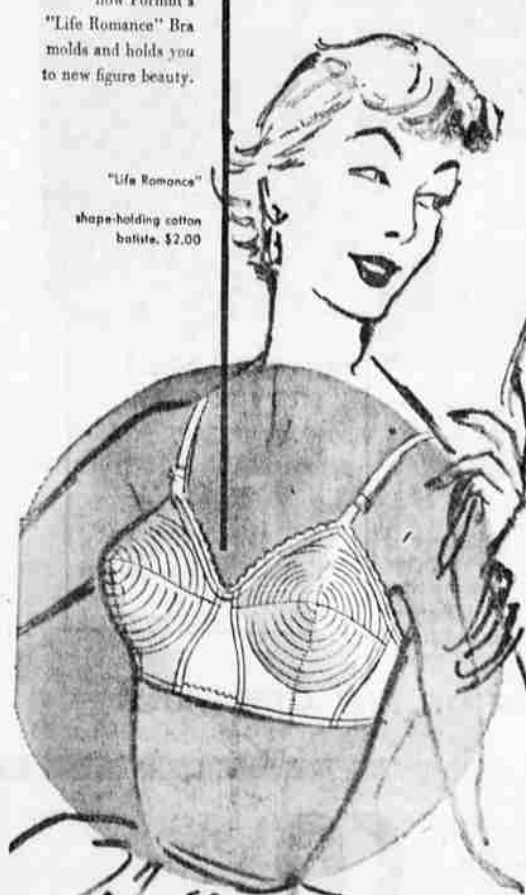
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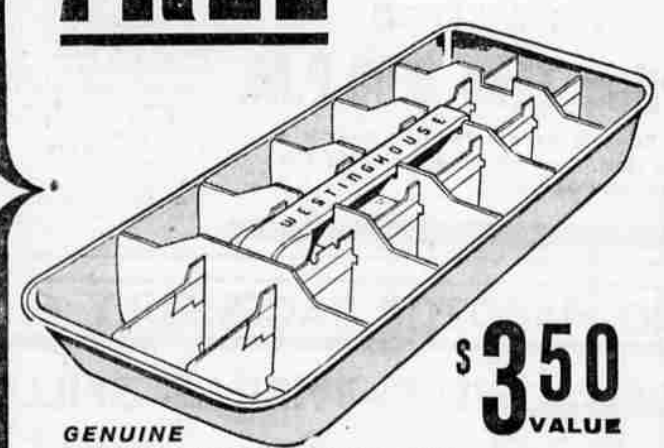


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
