Spear Couple Captures Mixed Bowling Doubles

Multnomah Dog Races Slated At Fairgrounds

PORTLAND (AP) — The Board of Multnomah County Commissioners voted Tuesday to permit dog racing at the Multnomah County fairgrounds at Gresham.

However, the management of Portland Meadows horse race track also offered to rent its facilities to the Multnomah County Kennel Club.

The dog racing club did not announce which of the two offers it would accept.

The club had offered the county 1 per cent of the gross parimutuel handle or a daily fee of \$1,000. Commissioners said the money derived from a race meeting would be used for parks and recreation in the county.

The Meadows race track's rental offer was similar to that offered to the county.

Contempt Charge Against Marilyn's Spouse Favored

WASHINGTON (AP) — The House committee on Un-American Activities Tuesday voted contempt proceedings against playwright Arthur Miller, bridegroom of actress Marilyn Monroe.

Miller refused on June 21 to answer committee questions about persons with whom he attended Communist Party writers' meetings in 1939 or 1940.

The 40-year-old writer told the committee about his own activities but said his conscience would not allow him to identify others.

The committee's action is subject to House consideration. Should the House approve it, the Justice Department will be asked to prosecute Miller.

Miller married Miss Monroe last month, and they plan to leave for Europe this coming weekend.

The committee action presumably will not interfere with their departure since it does not amount to an actual legal charge against Miller.

Flying Propeller Rips Plane, Kills Passenger

WINDSOR, Ont. (AP) — A propeller tore loose from a four-engine Trans-Canada airliner Monday and disintegrated while the plane was flying at 8,000 feet over Michigan. One blade ripped through the cabin, killing a woman passenger and injuring 10 other persons.

The turbo-prop Vickers Viscount which carried 30 passengers, was about 35 miles southwest of here when the accident occurred. The pilot made an emergency landing at Windsor Airport on two engines.

Killed was Mrs. Robert J. Lipfert, 31, whose husband is a doctor at the Mayo Clinic in Rochester, Minn. She was from Hanover, Ont.

Statement Anent Cost Of Library Disputed

A member of the Douglas County Taxpayers' League has taken exception to a recent statement by President Henry Goodmanson that the league was opposed to the high cost of the new county library.

Gen. Curtis T. Beecher said the opinions expressed by Goodmanson with respect to objections of the League were "the personal opinion of Mr. Goodmanson and do not express the official attitude of the taxpayers' league."

Beecher claimed he had checked the minutes of the meetings of the league with its secretary, Thomas Pargeter. "He (Pargeter) informs me there is no record of expression of opinion pro or con on the cost of the library 'as far as the Taxpayers' League is concerned,'" Beecher stated.

Goodmanson said the league was against the high costs of the bookmobile and the librarian's salary. "We're not against the library, but we don't want to pay two prices for it," he said.

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Oregon Projects In Military Bill Given President

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Senate Monday night approved the compromise military construction bill and sent it to the White House. It authorizes these Oregon projects:

Klamath Falls airport — Operational and training, maintenance, housing and community facilities, utilities and ground improvement and land acquisition, \$1,130,000.

Greater Portland area — Airport operational, training, maintenance, supply, administrative, housing and community facilities, utilities and ground improvements and land acquisition, \$13,508,000.

Umatilla Ordnance Depot — Storage facilities, \$258,000.

These projects all were included in the Defense Department request of Jan. 19. The House approved this construction program April 12. The Senate made some changes on projects in other states and the bill passed Monday night is the compromise version on which the House and Senate agreed.

These authorized projects are due to get money under a separate bill now in congressional committee. Earlier this month a House committee approved an appropriation for the full amount of the Umatilla depot authorization, for \$1,025,000 for the Klamath Falls airport, and for \$2,400,000 to get the Greater Portland airport started near St. Paul.

Ruptured Spinal Disc Sported By Marciano

BROCKTON, Mass. (AP) — Rocky Marciano, retired world heavyweight champion, has a ruptured disc in his spine but for the present no operation will be attempted.

Dr. Nathaniel Gould, orthopedic surgeon at the Brockton Hospital where Rocky has been receiving treatment for a week, made the announcement Tuesday.

Dr. Gould said that for the present Rocky will be given bed rest, heat massage and physiotherapy treatment which will continue for two or three weeks.

Klamath Death Car Driver Said Identified

KLAMATH FALLS (AP) — State Police Sgt. Earle Tichenor said Tuesday a witness had named Earl Graham, 34-year-old farm worker, as driver of a car which hit two young girls Sunday, killing one of them.

Graham and his brother, Freeman Lee Graham, 52, each had named the other as driver of the car. A companion, Claud Woods, 34, said he didn't know who was driving. He was charged with being drunk.

Sheridan Smith, 9, was killed and Shanna Hinz, 11, was seriously hurt when hit by the car as they pushed a bicycle along a road near Main.

Martin Brothers Change Title Of Corporation

The corporate name of Martin Bros Box Co. of Oakland has been changed to "The Martin Bros. Container and Timber Products Corp.," according to Oakland correspondent Edith Dunn.

It is merely a title change and reflects no change in ownership or management. The company recently bought out the inventory of wire and lumber from California Barrel Co. of Arcadia, Calif. The material will be used in wire bound boxes, which are made by the company in Oakland.

The company now also has a barker to peel logs for the plywood plant and a chipper for the waste which is shipped to the Camas, Wash., paper factory. The company does not chip whole logs. The plywood cores are made into studs.
