

Hearing On Interior Dept. Nomination Turns To Heat Over Medicine Used On Ike

WASHINGTON (AP)—A hearing on the nomination of Wesley A. D'Ewart to be assistant secretary of interior turned into a hot argument Wednesday over "smear" campaign methods and the treatment of President Eisenhower with dicumarol, a blood anti-coagulant.

The issue of the President's

treatment came up when Sen. Neuberger (D-Ore.) disclosed that he had written former Surgeon General Leonard A. Scheele concerning the safety of the use of dicumarol.

He said he had received an answer from the former Public Health Service chief which indicated the medicine is "highly controversial."

Neuberger placed the letter, which in quoting medical author-

ities ran for 10 pages, into the record of the Senate Interior Committee. Dr. Scheele said in one part of the letter that "it's (dicumarol) use and duration of treatment are matters to be determined by the physician in relation to the individual patient."

Striking Teamsters Use Blackjacks, Claim

OKLAHOMA CITY (AP)—Police said striking members of the Teamsters Union brought blackjacks into play Wednesday in an effort to halt what their leaders described as strike-breaking tactics by Oklahoma City transfer and storage firms.

Police said a driver for a firm not among the 11 strike-bound companies was attacked and slugged with a blackjack. Officers said Tom Gibson, 66, a driver for Bekins Van and Storage Co., was hit when he attempted to unload furniture at a city apartment.

Five other moving operations obtained police guards in an effort to head-off further violence.

OSC Student Loan Fund Totals \$100,000

More than \$100,000 was loaned to Oregon State College students by the student loan fund this past year to assist them in continuing their education.

OSC has a \$144,000 fund from which student loans are made. This fund was built up by contributions of persons interested in helping students, according to William Langan, faculty chairman.

Some 800 students borrowed money from the fund last year. The fund is an aid to students who have already earned income through their own efforts.

Amounts borrowed varied from \$10 to \$600. Loan periods were from 10 days to two years. Repayment failures are negligible, Langan said.

Biggest gift the loan fund received in 1955 was a \$20,000 grant from Mrs. Nellie Shaver of Portland. A seven-man faculty committee approves all loans made.
