

Columbia River Boundary Lines Given First Nods

VANCOUVER, Wash. (AP) — A permanent boundary between Oregon and Washington, unaffected by the shifting channel of the Columbia River, got tentative approval here Wednesday.

A boundary commission, named by the legislatures of the two states, approved the theme of picking permanent landmarks to mark the boundary. These landmarks will, in general, follow the main channel of the Columbia.

But, said Washington state Sen. Dale McMullen and Oregon state Sen. Rudie Wilhelm Jr., chairmen, it is agreed that islands which may shift do not make suitable markers.

They said at their meeting here Wednesday that Taylor or Crims island near Longview should be in Oregon and Biddle island, near Vancouver, should be in Washington. Because of the shifting river channel there has been so much confusion that a fishing license from either state has been honored on them.

Russia Rejects Eisenhower's Inspection Plan

UNITED NATIONS, N. Y. (AP) — Soviet Deputy Foreign Minister Andrei Gromyko Thursday accepted the ceilings for armed forces proposed by the Western powers for the first stage of disarmament.

Speaking before the U. N. Disarmament Commission, he dropped the Soviet Union's insistence on lower ceilings. He also proposed an agreement to stop nuclear bomb tests, eliminate stockpiles of such bombs, and their production and ban their use.

But he still refused to accept President Eisenhower's plan for aerial inspection of armed facilities to guard against surprise attack. He stood by the Soviet Union's proposals for control of disarmament by ground inspection only.

Gromyko also refused to agree to the West's demand that genuine disarmament should be preceded by settlement of international political problems such as the division of Germany, Korea and Viet Nam.

Gromyko agreed that as a first step the armed forces of the United States, the Soviet Union, and Communist China should be cut to 2 1/2 million each; those of Britain and France to 750,000 each and those of other countries to 150,000 to 200,000 each.

But he added that this should lead to a second step to reduce the United States, Soviet and Chinese forces to between 1 million and 1 1/2 million each, and British and French forces to 650,000 each. These were the ceilings which Russia previously had advocated.

Heavy Damage Suit Faces State Lawmaker

KLAMATH FALLS (AP) — A suit asking \$101,612.78 for damages allegedly arising from a traffic accident was filed Monday in circuit court against State Rep. Henry Semon, who lives on the Merrill Highway.

Filing the suit is Mildred Huffman, represented by The Dalles law firm of Dick and Dick. According to her complaint, an auto driven by Semon sideswiped an auto she was driving on the Merrill Highway one mile north of Merrill. She charges Semon with driving on the wrong side of the highway. The accident occurred Oct. 23, 1954.

She is asking \$100,000 general damages and \$1,612.78 special damages.

Other Decisions Pending

Still to be decided, McMullen said, is what to do about the line at the John Day Dam and McNary Dam pools. If it goes up the center of the pools it will split some buildings. Which way to shift the line will be subject of further conferences.

Once the commission has reached final decisions, the two legislatures will need to approve, the states' constitutions will have to be altered and Congress then will have to add its approval to make the new boundary effective.

Until this is done, commission members said, there will be recurrent questions with the most serious one being which state is to collect taxes.

Extra 10-Year Penalty Handed Oregon Convict

KLAMATH FALLS (AP) — Stanley Mayfield, 30-year-old inmate of Oregon State Prison, who was returned here when he demanded a speedy trial on a forgery charge, was sentenced to 10 more years Wednesday by District Judge Charles Foster.

The convict still has 18 months to serve of a three-year sentence received in Medford after his conviction on a bogus check charge.

Judge Foster ordered the sentences to run consecutively. Mayfield took advantage of a law passed at the last session of the State Legislature making it mandatory to provide a speedy trial for any convict who has a "hold" placed at the state prison. He pleaded guilty here.

Hospital Profit Exceeded Report, Congress Told

WASHINGTON (AP) — Morning-side Hospital, a privately owned Portland institution which cares for Alaskan mental patients under contract with the government, made twice as much profit as its owner reported to a congressional committee, the federal General Accounting Office reported Tuesday.

Wayne W. Coe, owner and president of the firm which operates the hospital, has diverted substantial sums from company accounts for the personal use of himself and his family, said U. S. Comptroller General Joseph Campbell.

No violations of law were charged in Campbell's report. However, he urged the Internal Revenue Bureau to "make a careful review of the federal income

tax returns of the sanitarium company and its president." "The examination also disclosed certain deficiencies in the administration of contract provisions for the secretary of the Interior by the Office of Territories," Campbell said.

The probe of the hospital's financial affairs was ordered after hearings on the Alaska mental health bill of Rep. Edith Green (D-Ore).

Coe told the committee that the firm's profit in the past 19 years was \$403,234. The GAO reported the profit at \$821,406.

Coe said the financial matters in question—including charging his household costs to the business—were "accepted general practice and general throughout the country."

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
