If the Milwaukee Braves should win the National League pennant, it will be because of the spectacular success enjoyed by pitcher Bob Buhl and first baseman Joe Adcock against the Brooklyn Dodgers.

Rarely, if ever, have two players from one team overpowered a club the way Buhl and Adcock have done against Brooklyn this season. For Buhl, this complete domination of the Dodgers is something new but it is old hat to Adcock, who has hit 25 of his 100 big league home runs against Dodger pitching. Buhl was only 2-5 against the Dodgers before this season.

The pair combined their talents last night to lift Milwaukee to within three percentage points of first place as the Braves shut out the Dodgers 2-0 and the league-leading Cincinnati Redlegs were beaten 7-4 by the Philadelphia Phillies. Decathlon Competition Attracts 43 Athletes

CRAWFORDSVILLE, Ind.—A lightning-fast track-barring rain—was ready Friday for 43 of America's top all-around athletes in their bid for a decathlon record and a trip to Australia for the Olympic Games.

An 8,000-point total was in reach. Favorite Iain Johnston set the world record in the Pan-American games last year at 7,983.

J. Owen Huntsman, Wabash director, said three men who will emerge Saturday night as the nation's Olympic decathlon team may be the three best men in the 10-event test since the Greeks started the Olympics in 746 B.C.

The Rev. Bob Richards of Los Angeles, three times national AAU champion, is defending the title he won last year with 6,873 points.

A UCLA sophomore who was second to Richards last year, is expected to show well in this year's competition.
