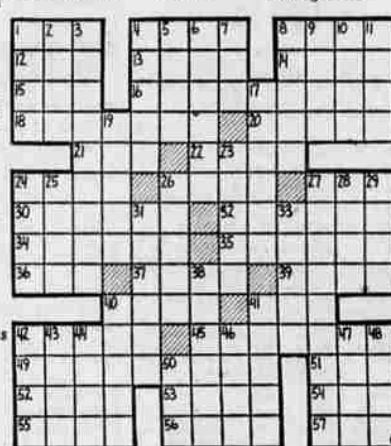
Working In Portland — Mrs. Wanda Althaus, well-known local musician, has accepted a position in Portland with Days Music Stores as organist and piano demonstrator.

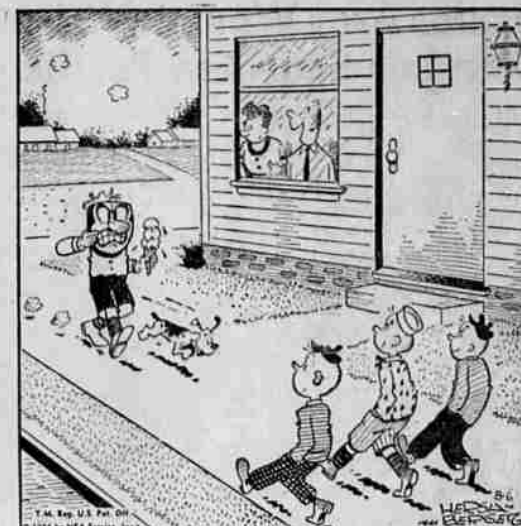
