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Handicap Fails To Stop Yoncalla Man's Skywatching

At least one Ground Observer Corps post in Douglas County doesn't have a manpower shortage. It is the one-man post operated by Jake Wilson about five miles northeast of Yoncalla. The post is in his home and he averages about 50 hours of skywatching a week.

Wilson, a veteran of World War I and badly crippled from that war, has been operating as a skywatcher intermittently since Dec. 11, 1952. Plane spotting is just one of the chores around his ranch, but it comes first and on some days not much work is accomplished.

On this airline, flights vary from a few planes to as many as 50 in ten hours, Wilson said. He reports by phone from 500 to 1,000 flights each month. One plane per call is usual, but sometime three or more are reported in a single conversation.

Because he is crippled, Wilson can not stand the work required to enter the house, each time a plane goes over. So, he has his telephone outside a window, along with the necessary records. With a comfortable chair and powerful binoculars, he is able to make identification of many types of aircraft.

The post is operated only in fair weather as cold and rains prevent him from outside watching, Wilson said.

Wilson began his GOC work in August 1941, with the organization of a post for training. Pearl Harbor found him ready and with help, he continued through World War II. The post was at Scotts Valley, on the site of the new school there. Nearly 100 persons served at this post.

He supervised many posts near Yoncalla, Drain and Cottage Grove during the war. Five schools were

their former home on the North Umpqua Road which they recently sold.

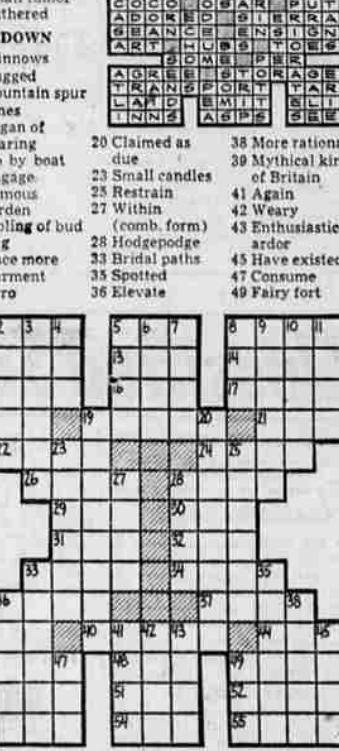
