

Circuit Court

Complaints
 Ry-Bar Distributing Co., Portland, vs. William Love, doing business as TV Center, Roseburg. Plaintiff asks judgment against defendant for recovery of \$1,813.85 and interest remaining on a \$1,913.85 promissory note and \$450 attorney's fees.

State Highway Commission vs. Charles P. and Myrtle S. Garrett and Community Gas and Oil Co. Plaintiff asks condemnation of more than six acres of defendants' land which plaintiff claims is necessary for widening and improving the Oakland-Deady section of Highway 99. Community Gas and Oil holds oil leases on land. Plaintiff also asks that jury be empaneled to determine compensation for land.

Norman D. Price vs. Dollar-Patterson Co. Plaintiff states he was hired on a yearly basis as a surveyor or on an oral contract with an annual retainer of \$3,600 in 1954. Says was paid \$4,500, but \$2,700 is still due. Asks judgment for this amount. Also asks \$498.33 allegedly due for special services performed.
