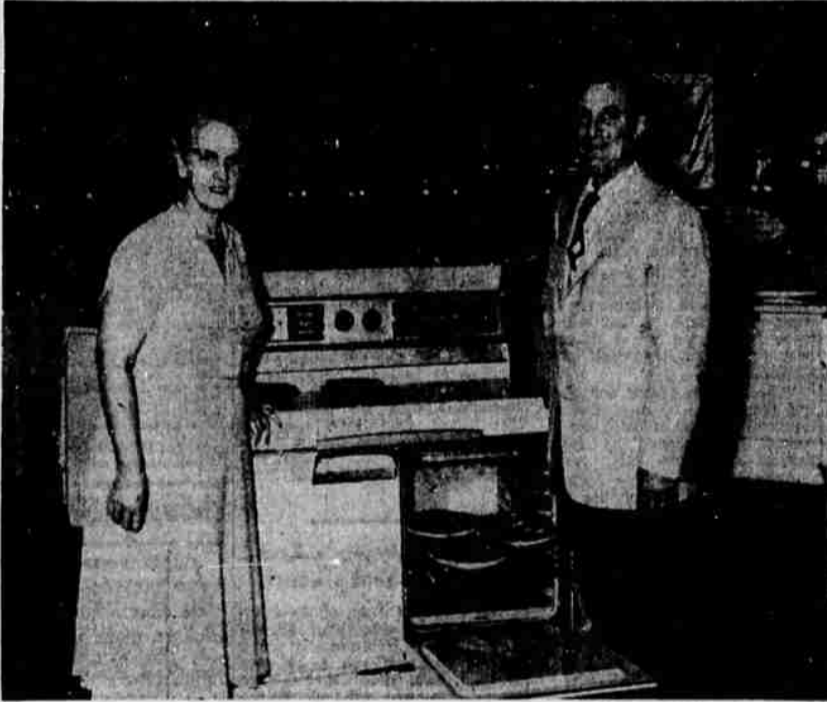

This bill shows 81 KW hours of consumption under Rate Schedule 10 for thirty days, August 1 to 30. In reviewing the account on which this test meter was installed we find that their monthly consumption was in excess of 300 KW hours per month so that this consumption shown would all be billed at .011 making the total bill for thirty days consumption shown on the meter as \$8.89.

As you understand from the billing schedule, this rate would apply to all consumption after the first 300 KW hours used.
