

John Witte Now 'Everybody's Choice'

Steiger, Day

NEW YORK (AP)—Oklahoma Half-back Tommy McDonald is the lone holdover on the 1956 Associated Press All-America football team announced today.

Center Jerry Tubbs of the national champion Sooners is also included on the squad chosen on the recommendations of regional boards blanketing the nation and based on all college games through Dec. 1.

Johnny Majors, the 162-pound tailback who led Tennessee to an unbeaten, untied season, rugged Jimmy Brown of Syracuse and Don Bosseler, Miami's wonder man, complete the backfield.

In addition to Tubbs, the line includes Ron Kramer of Michigan and Joe Walton of Pittsburgh at ends, Alex Karras of Iowa and John Witte of Oregon State at tackles with Bill Glass of Baylor and Jim Parker of Ohio State at guards.

Certificates will be presented to all members of the first three teams.

Great performers like Michigan State's Clarence Peaks and Southern California's Jon Arnett were withheld from consideration because of their limited half-season service.

Six of the players — Kramer, Brown, Parker, Bosseler, Tubbs and

Glass—were picked in the first round of the recent professional football draft.

Notre Dame's Paul Hornung, the bonus choice in the National football league, is in the second backfield.

Another second team selection was Bill Steiger of Washington State, the nation's leading pass receiver. Steiger is from Olympia, Wash.

Dick Day, a University of Washington guard from Longview, Wash., was a third team selection. In addition, 13 players from the Pacific Northwest received honorable mention.

The 13 Pacific Northwest play-

ers receiving honorable mention were:

End Phil McHugh of Oregon; tackles George Strugar of Washington and Dave Jesmer of Oregon State; guards Whitey Corro of Washington, Jerry Kramer of Idaho

and John Sniffen and Jim Brackins of Oregon State; and backs Earnest Duerksen, Joe Francis and Tom Berry of Oregon State, Dean Derby of Washington, Bob Newman of Washington State and Jim Stanley of Oregon.

For the second successive year, McDonald has been the chief executioner of Oklahoma's "bread and butter" play — the split-T option pitchout with Tommy capitalizing on the defense to either sweep the end or call on his pin-point passing ability.

In helping the Sooners run their victory string to 40, McDonald rushed 853 yards in 119 carries, scored 102 points, completed 8 of 12 passes for 183 yards, caught 4 scoring passes and was strong on defense.

Majors completed 36 of 58 passes for 32 yards, rushed 540, averaged 43 yards punting and called signals.

Brown, the light-footed 212 pounder who could run over or sidestep opponents with equal ease, rushed 596 yards, scored 106 points, was a top pass receiver and could throw as well. His 43 points against Colgate was a modern record against a major opposition.

Bosseler is rated the equal of Doc Blanchard by Coach Andy Gustafson, who has worked with both and believes Doc is the best defensive back he's ever seen.

With a game yet to play, Bosseler has ground out 677 yards through the middle of defensive lines packed to stop him and has yet to be stopped short of the line of scrimmage.

Kramer is called the "best end in Michigan history" by Coach Benjie Osterhaan. He caught 28 passes for 333 yards and 2 touchdowns, scored 33 yards and 2 touchdowns, scored 33 yards and 2 touchdowns, scored 33 yards and 2 touchdowns.

Witte had the stamina for 55-56 minutes of game and the skill to block and tackle. Oregon State to its first Pacific Coast conference championship since 1941. He will be opposed in the Rose Bowl by Karras who is the tower of strength for the Hawkeyes as the middle man in the defensive line.

Glass averaged 16 tackles per game and blocked Baylor backs to an average gain of four yards throughout a rugged Southwest conference campaign. Parker, at 282 pounds, had speed and agility, played 45% of a possible 540 minutes. Tubbs was consistently outstanding as a linebacker, pass defender and blocker. Against Iowa State he forced 73 yards to score on an interception.

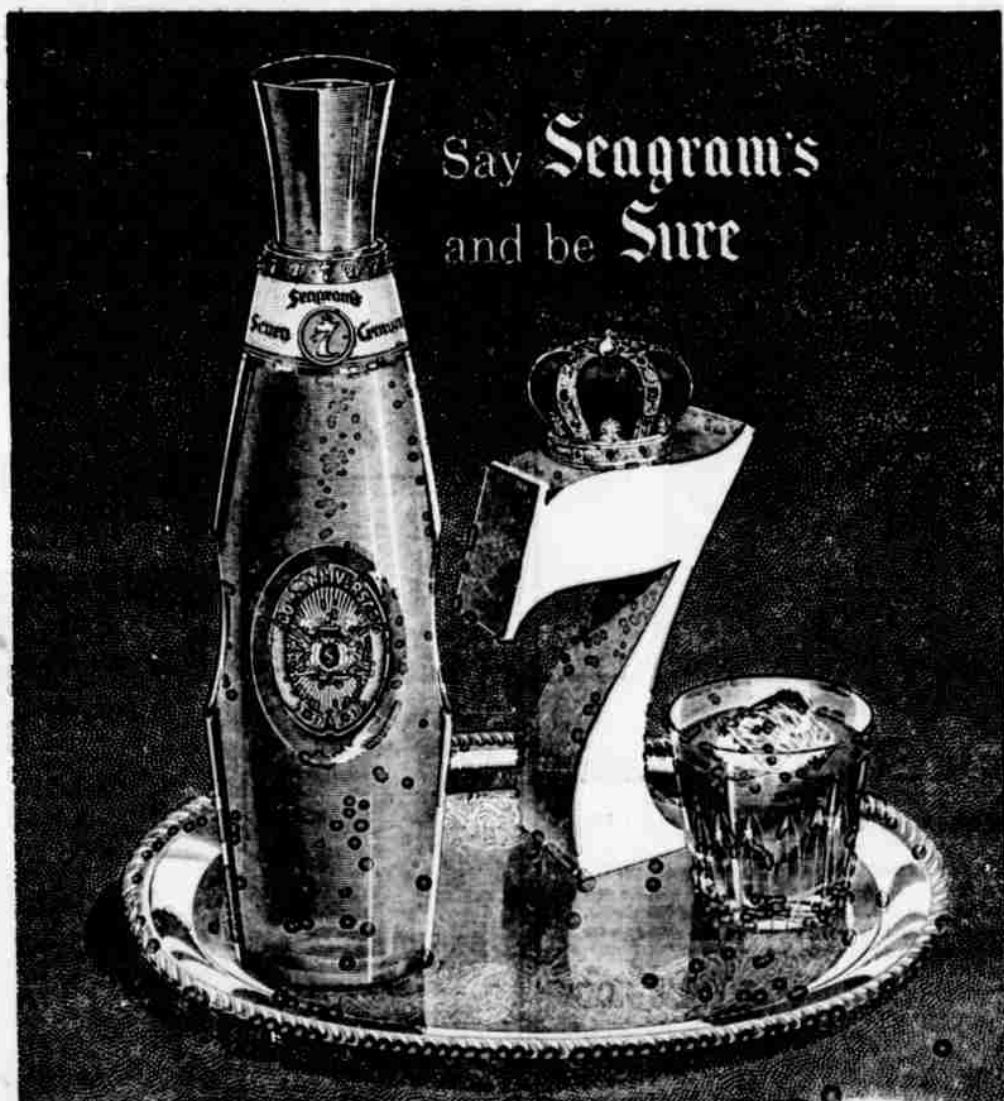
