He was born May 30, 1870, in Avena, Ill., and was married to Anna A. Hart Feb. 5, 1893, in Avena, Ill. The couple celebrated their 63rd wedding anniversary last Feb. 5. Mrs. Welker survives him.
They first came to Oregon in 1914, settling near Myrtle Creek, and later residing in or near Roseburg.
Surviving besides Mrs. Welker are two sons, A. L. Welker of Gold Hill and Glenn Welker of Roseburg; two daughters, Mrs. E. E. Sherman of Portland and Mrs. G. O. Schaub of Visalia, Calif.; a brother, C. R. Welker of Cranford, N.J.; nine grandchildren and 16 great-grandchildren.
Funeral services will be held Wednesday at 11 a.m. in the Chapel of the Roses with the Rev. Vernon Kleim of the Assembly of God Church officiating. Vault interment will follow in the Roseburg Memorial Gardens.
