Eight Employees Of Phillips Oil Co. Die In Crash

BARTLESVILLE, Okla. (AP)—Eight employees of Phillips Petroleum Co. were killed Wednesday when a company airplane spun into a ranch pasture. The crash occurred four miles southeast of here only a few minutes after the plane had taken off from Bartlesville's airport.

There were no survivors. One of the victims was A. M. Rippel, 61, head of Phillips' natural gas department. Others were W. C. Reed, a company attorney, C. W. Binkley, George Sneed, D. F. Mayfield and T. D. Young, all members of the gas division and the two pilots, Joe Bowers and R. E. Ulrich.

The plane, a Lockheed Lodestar, was used for transportation of Phillips executives.

H. C. Black of nearby Nowata, a Sinclair Pipeline Co. worker, said he was the first person at the wreckage after he saw the twinned engine craft go into a spin and crash.

He said he was driving along U.S. Highway 75 when he noticed the plane "fairly high" in the air. He said it suddenly began losing altitude and spun into a field out of his sight behind a hill. A "big black cloud of smoke" immediately arose.

"There was an awful concussion when the plane hit," Black said. When he neared the plane, he said, there was no sound or sign of life and the plane's cabin was a mass of flames. He said the intense heat kept him a good distance away. Pieces of metal were scattered over a radius of 150 to 200 feet.

Sheriff Schunk Wins New Trial In Damage Suit

SALEM (AP)—Multnomah County Sheriff Terry D. Schunk won a new trial Wednesday in a damage suit that once raised the question whether he could continue in office.

Mrs. Thular B. Hammons, Grants Pass, won a \$12,780 verdict against Schunk, charging that his office failed to serve a summons in connection with an auto accident in which Mrs. Hammons was injured. The accident occurred in Josephine County and she said failure to serve the summons resulted in dismissal of her damage suit.

The state Supreme Court ordered a new trial Wednesday on the ground that the lower court permitted improper questions to be asked concerning Schunk's assets.

After the lower court verdict, the question was raised whether Schunk could continue in office. Gov. Elmo Smith ruled that he could.

He now is resigning anyway, to become mayor of Portland and with which office he was elected last month.

The opinion, by Justice William C. Perry, reversed Circuit Judge Pro Tem P. J. Gallagher of Multnomah County.

Nixon Said Interested In Looking At Refugees

VIENNA (AP)—Vice President Nixon is "interested" in coming to Austria for a look at the refugees from Hungarian communism, the U.S. embassy said Wednesday.

Any announcement of the visit will come from Washington. The U.S. State Department said Wednesday.

Receipts in the first 11 months of this year totaled \$12,110,350, and the year's total will go over the 13 million mark.
