Spellman Sees Only 60 Minutes War Warning

LOS ANGELES (AP)—The United States, says Francis Cardinal Spellman, "may get only 60 minutes warning if war comes."

The Archbishop of New York, arriving by plane Monday from the Far East, told newsmen at the airport.

"The slaughtering of people in Hungary should give Americans the firm, definite impression that we must be alert and on our guard."

The cardinal represented Pope Pius XII at the National Eucharistic Congress at Manila and then visited American servicemen in Okinawa and Japan.

He leaves for New York today, and plans to spend Christmas with this country's servicemen in Greenland.

21 Jet Engines Bought By Airline

WASHINGTON (AP)—Donald W. Nyrop, president of Northwest Airlines, said Wednesday Northwest has purchased 21 jet engines but has not yet ordered the airplanes in which they will be used.

Nyrop told a reporter the Pratt and Whitney J75 jet engines were ordered last April after the manufacturer gave notice a price increase was coming.

Nyrop did not disclose the price paid for the engines. Other sources said, however, that Northwest probably saved more than a half million dollars by buying before the reported 15 per cent price increase went into effect.

Nyrop said the engines would not be delivered until 1960.

Nyrop, here on business for the airline, said Northwest hasn't decided whether to buy the Boeing 707 or the Douglas DC8 jet transport. He indicated a decision will be made within 90 days.

ITU Members Defeat Increase In Union Dues

INDIANAPOLIS (AP)—The International Typographical Union said Wednesday its 100,000 printers and mailers have defeated proposals to raise basic union dues and strike defense fund assessments.

Two other constitutional amendments approved in the mail referendum give the Executive Council jurisdiction over new work processes and revise ITU's delegate strength in the AFL-CIO and Canadian Labor Congress.

ITU headquarters said the proposal to raise basic international dues from \$1 to \$1.50 a month was defeated 38,996 to 37,497. The proposal to raise the defense fund assessment from 1/2 of 1 per cent of earnings to 1 1/2 per cent was defeated, 42,513 to 34,069.

The higher assessment was intended to build up a defense fund of 5 to 10 million dollars.

The work processes amendment was approved, 67,861 to 8,591. The delegate proposal was accepted, 64,191 to 11,680.

The proposals were referred to the union's 790 locals after being initiated at ITU's convention in Colorado Springs in September.
