

Motorist Plunges 150 Feet Down Bank, Swims River, Faces Reckless Driving

ELLENSBURG, Wash. — A motorist plunged 150 feet down a near-vertical highway bank, swam the icy Yakima River and spent seven hours huddled on a river island early Tuesday—and wound up being charged with reckless driving.

Bob D. Lillie, 24, Toppenish, Wash., was brought to Valley General Hospital here after his rescue by state patrolmen and Kittitas County sheriff's officers. Physicians said he suffered only from exposure and his condition was not believed serious.

A companion, Walter Bastien, 36, Ellensburg, who was in the car with Lillie in the plunge down the highway bank, was unhurt. Sheriff Bob Dorsey and State Patrolman Quintin Carollo said it started when Lillie and Bastien left here in Lillie's car about 1 a.m. to drive to Wapato.

About 5 miles south of here, Carollo said, Lillie lost control of the car on a curve. The car skidded backwards down the bank in-

to a ditch alongside Northern Pacific Railroad tracks.

Carollo said Bastien climbed the bank, was found lying alongside the highway and was brought to the police station here.

The state patrolman said when officers reached the scene they found that the bedridden Lillie had crawled from the car, made his way across the railroad tracks and blundered into the swollen river. Despite drifting logs and other debris, he bucked the current 150 feet to the island.

Rescuers got a boat but found they couldn't lower it down the steep hill and finally ran it down the railroad tracks on a gasoline speeder to a point opposite the island. Darkness and rain impeded the rescue which was further complicated when the boat broke away. It traveled 19 miles down the canyon before it could be recaptured.

Lillie was finally brought across the river at 8:15 a.m. and taken to the hospital here.

It was then the reckless driving charge was filed. Bond was set at \$150.

Communist Boss Says Opposition Is Futile

BERLIN — Communist boss Walter Ulbricht, trying to quell anti-Soviet unrest in East German universities, told students Wednesday that opposition to communism is futile and will be shattered.

Ulbricht's action took the form of a long, pleading—and threatening—letter published in a special edition of Forum, the official magazine of the East German Communist youth organization.

The letter was another indication the East German regime is worried by an opposition fever developing among the students ever since the Hungarian rebellion began.

Ulbricht blamed the unrest on Western radio stations, newspapers and what he called provocateurs.

Bomb Explosions Rock Persian Gulf Oil Field

LONDON — The British Foreign Office said Wednesday "a number" of bomb explosions rocked the big Kuwait oil field in the Persian Gulf Tuesday. Only one of the 185 wells in the field was set afire and over-all production is unaffected, a spokesman added.

Security forces searching for the saboteurs located several unexploded time bombs near the blazing well, which was still on fire Wednesday morning, the spokesman said. No casualties or arrests were reported.

The British-protected state of Kuwait supplies 60 per cent of Britain's crude oil imports. Tuesday's bomb blasts were apparently in line with the Arab oilworkers' union's call for sabotage of Western oil installations protesting the British-French attack on Egypt.

Movie Industry Censors Revise Code For Films

NEW YORK — Movie industry censors have revised the movie code for the first time since it was adopted in 1930.

New standards, stricter in some senses and more lenient in others, were announced Tuesday by the Motion Picture Assn. of America, the movie industry's self-imposed censoring board. The regulations are known familiarly as the "Hays Code" because of their adoption while the late Will H. Hays was president of the association.

Eric Johnston, president of the MPA, in announcing some 20 changes, said the new code "is already in effect—Hollywood has been advised."

Johnston and Ken Clark, vice president of the association, said it was not possible to "characterize or sloganize" the effect of the revision. Johnston said, however, he thought the code was "more flexible" than the older one.

The new code permits the treatment, "within the limits of good taste," of such subjects as abortion, kidnapping of children and the illegal traffic in and use of narcotics.

At the same time, it adds "thou shalt nots" in the form of mercy killing, blasphemy and double meanings.

Under a general section entitled "sex," the new code specifically bans "open-mouth kissing," adding this to a section that already forbids "lustful kissing, lustful embraces, suggestive posture and gestures."

The new code followed almost a year of study and countless consultations by a committee of film company executives appointed by Johnston.
