Mrs. George C. Wimer, native of Myrtle Creek and former resident of Roseburg, died Dec. 11 in a Medford hospital. A brother-in-law, Everett Wimer, Roseburg, reported she had been ill for the past 10 days, following a heart attack.

Mrs. Wimer, the former Veve Dyer, was born in Myrtle Creek and moved with her husband in the early 1930s to Roseburg, where he was employed with the Southern Pacific Co. The family moved to Medford about 20 years ago.

Survivors include the husband and two sons, Donald, Fresno, Calif., and Elvin, stationed in Florida with the Air Force.

Funeral services will be held at 1 p.m. Friday at the Conger Morris Funeral Home in Medford.

Church Further 'Unfrocks' Vicar

CHESTER, England (AP) — The vicar who left his clothes on a beach and ran off with a wealthy woman has been unfrocked by the Church of England.

A consistory court stripped the orders of priest and deacon from Philip St. John Wilson Ross, former vicar of Woodford, for causing "grave scandal to the church and his holy orders." He was "removed, deposed and degraded" from all his clerical offices.

Ross, 52, disappeared in August 1955. His clothes were found on a beach in Wales and it was believed he had drowned. His wife mourned him for dead and his parishoners laid out a memorial garden for him at the Woodford church.

Last October the missing vicar was found living under another name with a wealthy British woman in Switzerland.

Ross, who returned to England and went into hiding, did not appear at the trial.

Lookingglass Church Hears Talk On Fellowship Work

The Rev. Mr. Richard Benoit of Junction City, accompanied by Mr. and Mrs. Melvin Hofmann of Winchester, presented the work of the World Radio Missionary Fellowship, Inc., at the Lookingglass Church on Monday evening. The fellowship sponsors the radio station HCB, known as "The Voice of the Andes," situated at Quito, Ecuador, with broadcasting tower on top of the mountains. Rev. Benoit explained the location as being particularly favorable for the transmission by both long and short wave and reaching entirely around the world.

This is the 25th anniversary of the founding of the station, said the Rev. Mr. Benoit, and they now have offices in the United States, Canada, Britain, Australia and Jamaica in addition to the one in Ecuador. Located as they are, said the speaker, ten miles south of the

equator has proven a decided advantage in circling the globe and in all directions. He referred briefly to the persistence of the founders of the station in going ahead in the face of strong objections by consulting engineers who insisted that the close proximity to the equator would interfere with the broadcast.

The North American headquarters of the fellowship, said the Rev. Mr. Benoit, are located in Detroit, Mich., and Los Angeles. They total 20 offices here and abroad. Rev. Benoit, western representative of the Fellowship, stated that he is available for radio rallies, mission emphasis services, conferences and summer camps.
