

Study Of Crimes Of Sex Proposed By Committee

PORTLAND — A broad legislative program for the control of sex crimes in Oregon was recommended Wednesday by a legislative interim committee that has been studying the problem for many months.

The interim committee to study sex crimes in Oregon outlined its series of 17 proposals here in a report based on hearings held in Portland, Eugene, Salem, Klamath Falls and Bend.

Topping the list is the recommendation that Oregon set up a state bureau of criminal identification and investigation. One purpose would be to serve as a collecting agency for fingerprints of suspects in felonies and all sex crimes.

Under the present set-up, the committee pointed out, there is a lack of statistics on which to base research on sex crimes.

The proposed central bureau would be separate from present law enforcement agencies. It would be under the jurisdiction of the governor, but otherwise would be patterned largely after such a bureau in California.

The interim committee directed that its recommendations be drafted into bills for presentation to the 1957 Legislature. The bills will be drawn up by the committee chairman, Sen. Carl Francis, Dayton, and Sen. Harry Boivan, Klamath Falls.

Police Maintain Alert For Stolen Tractor-Trailer

NEW YORK — Police maintained an all-state alarm today for a stolen tractor-trailer loaded with damaged vaccines and antitoxins.

The truck and contents disappeared Wednesday from a Manhattan loading platform.

The drugs were part of a shipment from Lederle Laboratories, Pearl River, N.Y., to its Chicago branch office. The truck carrying them caught fire in Ohio and 730 cartons out of 2,709 were damaged.

The Chicago office was returning the damaged cartons to Pearl River, where they were to be destroyed. The drugs included diphtheria antitoxins, tetanus toxoid and vaccines for mumps and typhoid.

The police alarm says the drugs were "contaminated and may be fatal to anyone making use of the same improperly."

A Lederle spokesman has denied this, saying the stolen drugs would not kill anyone if administered and that they had lost all their potency because of the heat of the fire.

Workman Finally Freed From Ditch

PORTLAND — A sewer ditch cave-in held a workman trapped at the bottom of a 10-foot ditch more than three hours Wednesday, but he finally was freed and said he felt all right.

Alex W. Moes, 35, the workman said he could walk, but he was carried instead to a waiting ambulance.

Moes was trapped as he ran to escape the falling walls at 9:15 a.m. Timbers formed an air space around his head and kept him alive in the early part of the rescue which was completed at 12:35 p.m.

Shortly before noon his head was fully exposed and cribbing was built around it as rescuers tunneled in to him.

One of the workmen said that as Moes lay there he seemed unharmed "but he's sore from lying there with all that weight on him."

Two other escaped just ahead.

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Transport With Refugees Leaves German Harbor

BREMERHAVEN, Germany — The American troop transport Gen. LeRoy Elinge steamed out of this German North Sea port Thursday with 1,750 Hungarian refugees headed for a new life in the United States.

The 10,000-ton vessel pulled away from Columbus quay here just after noon for the nine-day trip across the Atlantic.

Fog had delayed the departure for 25 hours. It was the first of three ships scheduled to transport

5,500 refugees to new homes in America. An airlift is taking 9,500 others, but fog was delaying it, too.

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
