Air Force Will Display Missiles

WASHINGTON — The Air Force changed its mind Thursday and decided to show off its missiles in the inaugural parade on Jan. 21 — just as the Army and Navy will do.

The Air Force had planned no show of weapons in line with President Eisenhower's desire to tone down the military aspects of his second inauguration.

But last week the Army announced it would have six missiles in the parade — a Redstone, a Corporal, two Honest Johns and two Nikes. The Navy at the same time said it would display four missiles — a Regulus, Terrier, Sidewinder and Sparrow.

Maj. Gen. John G. Van Houten, chairman of the inaugural committee's Armed Forces Participation Committee, announced Thursday that Gen. Nathan F. Twining, Air Force chief of staff, had agreed to display three of his service's missiles — the Matador, the Snark and the Falcon.

There will be no flyover of Air Force planes during the parade, as in the past.
