## New \$100,000 Reclaim Operation Started At Martin Bros. Company

A new \$100,000 lumber reclaim operation, commonly called "shook mill," at Martin Bros. Container and Timber Products Corp. Sutherlin plant, began functioning Wednesday at half-scale production.

The operation, first such in Douglas County mills, will put to profitable use minor grades of lumber, numbers three and four, which previously were sold in wholesale lots.

Now, according to plant Superintendent Ray Martin, the third and fourth grade lumber can be converted to use as base and cleat material in boxes and crates.

The production-line process begins at one end of the two city-block long plant where three sawyers will cut the third and fourth grade lumber into sections. Three more of these automatic Irvinson cutoff saws will soon be added.
