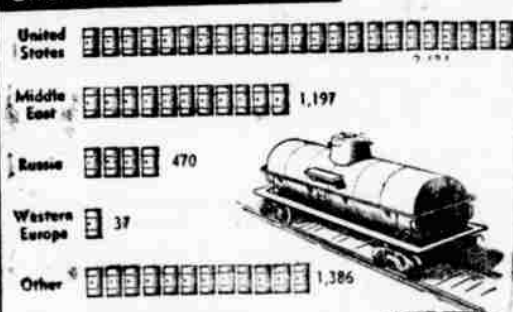

CRUDE OIL PRODUCTION



OIL: U.S. LEADS IN PRODUCTION—The United States produces more crude oil than any other country in the world. Deprived of Middle East oil, the Western European countries—Britain, France, Germany, Italy, The Netherlands, Belgium—are unable to provide for themselves. Currently producing 7,100,000 barrels of crude oil per day, United States may increase daily production by 800,000 to 850,000 barrels to meet Europe's needs. All The Speed, Precision, Know-how Of Military Plan Go Into Restocking Lakes

PORTLAND — All the speed, precision and know-how of an aerial military operation went into the recent stocking of two remote Pacific Northwest mountain lakes with fingerling salmon.

The fish drop, one of the largest ever accomplished, was a cooperative undertaking by the Air Force's 403rd Troop Carrier Wing (Reserve) and the Fish and Wildlife Service (FWS). It served to train the Air Force reservists in one of their principal tasks—dropping supplies into just such inaccessible areas. And it provided a future supply of sockeye salmon to give a shot in the arm to the diminishing fishing industry of the region.

The operation succeeded in dropping 200,000 fingerlings from a C-46 into Spirit Lake near Mt. St. Helens in Washington and 50,000 into Lost Lake near Mt. Hood in Oregon.

In making the five passes over Spirit Lake, the plane, on each trip, had to cross a 4,200 foot mountain and dip to within 100 feet of the water. The fish were released in the half-minute the plane was over the lake.

The single drop at Lost Lake, surrounded by mountains as high as 6,000 feet, had to be accomplished in 20 seconds.

Col. Robert W. Sheets, 403rd commander, said the operation, while not hazardous, required "extreme caution." It was directed by Lt. Col. Vernon E. Acker and Capt. Jack J. Shelton, both Air Force reservists who are members of the FWS staff.

To carry the fingerlings, FWS technicians mounted in the cargo space of the C-46 a 1,000 gallon tank equipped with oxygen and

Guided Missiles Assure Against Enemy Knockout

COLORADO SPRINGS, Colo. — Nike guided missiles assure that America "cannot be knocked out by air attack," says Lt. Gen. Stanley R. Mickelsen, chief of the Army anti-aircraft command.

"Any enemy knows that our Nike missile system can destroy his bombers. As these bombers can be prevented from reaching their vital targets, the enemy realizes the task of destroying America is beyond his capabilities," he said in an interview Friday.

If an aggressor "cannot wreak havoc on American cities, he realizes that his bid for supremacy through world war must fail."

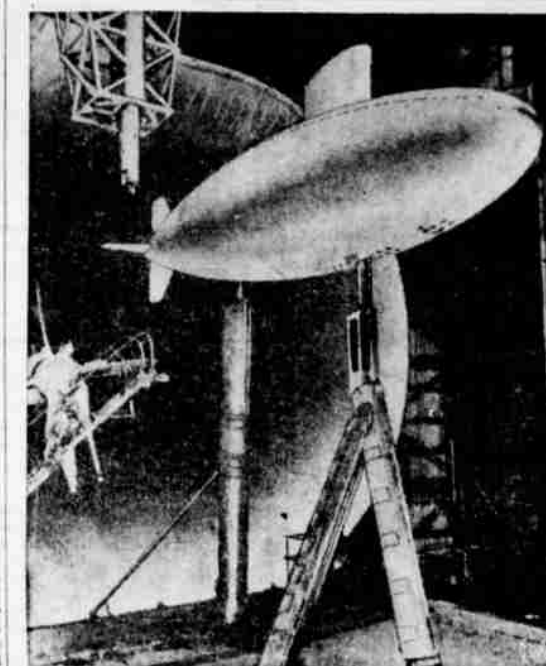
Gen. Mickelsen commands all Army anti-aircraft defenses in the continental United States. He said the Army has two big missions — to prevent war by readiness; to fight and win the war if an aggressor starts one. He described Army development of the Nike guided missile "one of the most important contributions to peace from the threat of world war."

Plan Would Unite NW In Creation Of Power Projects

VANCOUVER, Wash. — Proposed legislation to create a public regional corporation which would finance and build Northwest power projects was disclosed here Saturday by the Northwest Public Power Association.

The organization, to be known as the Columbia River Development Corporation, would be similar in form to one established under the St. Lawrence Seaway Bill.

The body would be directed by a five-man board of Northwest residents, one elected from each of the states of Montana, Idaho, Washington and Oregon. The president, with the consent of the Senate, would appoint a chairman.

Actual construction of dams would be by the Corps of Engineers and Bureau of Reclamation. However the functions of the Bonneville Power Administration in marketing and transmitting power would be assumed by the corporation.

The proposed bill also calls for the issuance of 50-year electric revenue bonds to finance the construction of electric generation and transmission facilities.

The question of retail distribution remains a matter for separate, local determination, as the bill does not concern itself with whether power is sold locally by public or private utilities.

RECORD SHIPPING

PORTLAND — A record 9-829,644 tons of maritime cargo passed over Portland docks in 1956—7.3 per cent more than the previous high in 1955.

The Merchants Exchange, in making the report, said increased foreign trade was responsible. Exports advanced 77 per cent and imports 37 per cent. Domestic and Hawaiian trade dropped slightly from the previous year.

NLRB Denies Petitions For Bargaining Elections

WASHINGTON — The National Labor Relations Board Friday denied petitions for bargaining agency elections at the Bandon and Norway, Ore., plywood plants of Tectron, Inc.

Plywood local 2784 already holds recognition as bargaining agent for the Cogille and Bandon plants of the company.

The Plywood, Box Shook & Door Council, district 9, of the International Woodworkers had asked an election at the Bandon and Norway plants.

The issue came down to what was the appropriate bargaining unit. The International Woodworkers contended the Bandon and Norway plants individually were appropriate units. Plywood Local 2784 contended all three Tectron plants constituted the appropriate unit.

The NLRB decided the unit should include all three plants. Since neither union had petitioned for an election in all three plants, the petitions were dismissed.

LONDON — A leading British fashion writer has picked Mamie Eisenhower as one of the world's 10 worst-dressed women. Anne Scott-James, writing in The Sunday Express, said America's First Lady dresses like a little girl.
