## Eisenhower Asks Alaska Be Granted Statehood

WASHINGTON — President Eisenhower asked Congress Wednesday to grant statehood to Alaska.

It was his strongest declaration yet for making the northern territory a state. Last year he said only that he hoped Congress would make "progress toward statehood for Alaska in this (1956) session."

Wednesday's request came in his annual budget message to Congress, in which he also asked statehood for Hawaii.  
The President attached conditions in his Alaskan proposal. He said statehood legislation should contain safeguards for the conduct of defense activities there.

His budget proposed \$24,714,530 for federal activities, outside of military operations, in Alaska in the year starting July 1.

## Search Believed Ended In Intensive Manhunt

DETROIT — The signed statement of a 38-year-old bachelor was studied by police today in what they believe may be the climax of Detroit's most intensive manhunt.  
Detective L. Glenn Collier said Philip J. Singer signed a formal statement admitting in detail the Jan. 2, 1953, slaying of 18-year-old Joann Gillespie.

The discovery of the girl's body, raped and beaten, in an alley near her home electrified Detroit at the time and has baffled police ever since.  
"More than 6,000 persons had been questioned in the crime, among them Singer, and then released."

## Northern Idaho Teachers Gain Strike Support

BONNERS FERRY, Idaho — Northern Idaho teachers claimed southern Idaho support Wednesday for their plan to stay away from classes for six days to protest low salaries to the Legislature.  
Earl Barnard, president of the Boundary County Teachers' Assn. here, has called on teachers throughout the state to join his group in a walkout and he said some have indicated they will do so.  
The Butte County Teachers' Assn. expressed sympathy at a meeting at Arco in southern Idaho and voted to walk out for a week if 50 per cent of the other units in the Idaho Education Assn. agree, he said.  
Teachers at neighboring Clark

Fork in Bonner County have also decided to follow the Boundary action regardless of what their county unit decides to do, he said.  
Top officials of the Idaho Education Assn. have repudiated the idea and said they don't expect it to spread. Legislators who have commented in Boise have also criticized the proposal.  
Barnard said he was disappointed at the IEA's reaction and that "everything the association has tried to increase salaries properly and dramatize our situation has failed."  
He said the 50 Boundary teachers plan to walk out the day after the Legislature's appropriation bill for education goes to committee in Boise. There is no indication when that will be.

Boundary teacher's salaries range from \$2,600 to \$3,300 a year, he said, and teachers who walk out will be docked on their pay check for the six days unless the time is made up to meet the 172-day classroom minimum.  
"We are willing to forfeit some of our pay now for results later," he said in letters mailed to IEA units throughout the state.

HOLY WATER ON WAY  
BARCELONA, Spain — Holy water from the fount where St. Vincent Ferrer was baptized in Valencia in 1205 a.d. was sent by plane to Monte Carlo Wednesday. It will be used in the baptism of the baby of Prince Rainier and Princess Grace, whose birth is expected any day now.

## 4 Missing Boys Found Safe In Mountains

VANCOUVER, Wash. — Four boys missing since Tuesday night in foothills 35 miles north of here Wednesday were found in good condition, the Cowlitz County sheriff's office reported by radio.  
A 30-man search party earlier Wednesday covered the area after two cars were found bogged down in snow and mud.  
The boys apparently took refuge in the cabin Tuesday night as temperatures dropped below freezing.  
They were identified as Don Sage, 17, Vancouver; and Allen Becker, 16, Vancouver; and John Ridgeway, 20, both of Battle Ground. A fourth boy was identified only as "Kreinbring."

## Runaway Youths Admit Slaying Hiker For \$1.50

PHOENIX, Ariz. — Five runaway teenagers, the oldest 16, were held for investigation of murder Wednesday in the killing of a hitchhiker "for a lousy dollar and a half." All admit at least a part in the crime.  
The case began last Sunday when the bullet-ridden body of 60-year-old Al W. Jennings, a roustabout cook who worked up and down the West, was found by some duck hunters about 50 miles west of Phoenix.

On Friday, five California teenagers had been picked up about 100 miles east of Phoenix and held for Ventura, Calif., officers, who wanted to question three of them for assault.

Sheriff's Sgt. Bob Collins identified the five as Kenneth Blahosky, 16, Whittier; Paul Councilman, 16, Los Angeles; and Harold Pogue, 14; Bobby Donohue, 15, and Ginger Lee Anderson, 14, all of Bell Gardens.

Officers found this in their car: Three high-powered rifles, knives, ammunition, a blood-smeared shirt and letters addressed to Jennings.

Shown that evidence Tuesday night, Sheriff L. C. Bois said, they quickly admitted their parts in the killing.

The sheriff said they told him they picked up Jennings on the road Friday and drove to a lonely spot on the desert for lunch and there they killed him.

Under questioning, Blahosky broke down and moaned: "A dollar and a half. For a lousy dollar and a half I killed a man."
