Bank Deposits Slightly Lower In Douglas Co.

Deposits in Douglas County's six banks fell below the 60-million dollar mark in 1956 after hitting that figure in 1955.

A total of deposits revealed a figure of \$58,428,511.56 at the end of 1956. At the same time the year before, the figure had crowded over the \$61-million mark.

As in 1955, the independent Douglas County State Bank and U. S. National Bank of Roseburg carried the most deposits in the county. Deposits at the bank, which first opened its doors Nov. 9, 1953, totaled \$1,900,373.90.

Meanwhile, loans and discounts totals also dropped in 1956, by almost a million dollars. The total in the year-end reports was \$26,241,277.13. In December 1955, it was slightly over \$27 million. The major drop in the figure was noted at the Douglas County State Bank where loans and discounts fell from \$15 million to \$13 million. Slight increases in the total were noted at the Roseburg U. S. National, the South Umpqua State and Drain U. S. National.

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
