### O&C VOLUME DIPS

PORTLAND (AP) — The value and volume of 1956 timber sales on O&C forest lands both dipped below record 1955 levels, the Bureau of Land Management reported today.

State supervisor Virgil Heath said the year's total sales in the western Oregon forests was 569,779,000 board feet, valued at \$20,372,634.

In 1955, the 603,229,000 board feet sold was valued at \$21,379,769.

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
