Russ Story Of American Secrets Bought False

WASHINGTON (AP) — Atty. Gen. Brownell says Russian Maj. Yuri P. Krylov "did not have any American accomplices." An unnamed "American citizen" from whom the Soviet attaché tried to buy military secrets reported the attempt, Brownell added.

Krylov, assistant military attaché at the Soviet embassy, was ordered last week to leave the United States "immediately." The State Department said Krylov had tried to buy classified military information and had purchased electronic equipment to which he had no right acting through "American intermediaries."

Man Held For Theft Of Valuable Container

BOSTON (AP) — The FBI today announced the arrest of a Boston air freight employee on a charge of theft of a \$30,000 jewel-encrusted gold coffee maker used to spark the March of Dimes fund drive.

The urn was recovered in Hollywood, Fla., the FBI said.

Oscar Smith Jr., 44, an employee of Emery Air Freight Co. of Logan International Airport, is alleged to have accepted the urn Wednesday for shipment to the Outlet Co. Store, Providence, R. I. However, E. J. Powers, special agent of the Boston office, said Smith sent the coffee maker to a fictitious consignee at a Hollywood motel.

Powers said Smith planned to telephone the motel and have the package held until his arrival there.
