Israel Refuses To Vacate Seized Egyptian Lands

UNITED NATIONS, N.Y. — Israel today stuck by its own proposals to keep Egyptian troops out of the Gaza Strip and the Gulf of Aqaba coastline.

It denounced U. N. Secretary General Dag Hammarskjold's suggested solution as an attempt to restore a regime which has already ended in disaster.

Israel still insisted on Israel's unconditional withdrawal from all Egyptian territory as the 80-nation General Assembly took up Hammarskjold's report that Israeli invasion forces had "not fully complied" with five Assembly requests to return to their 1949 borders.

Israel's adamant stand was expected to spur the demands of the Arab nations for U. N. economic sanctions.

Israel offered once again to negotiate with Egypt of an over-all peace settlement. Egypt has spurned similar suggestions in the past. An Egyptian spokesman maintained full Israeli withdrawal was necessary before any other issues are taken up, declaring:

"The Israelis are trying to force a solution by their arms on Egypt."

Conrad Julius Lundeen, 73, Sutherlin, died at a local hospital Saturday evening following a stroke Saturday morning.

He was born at Forest Lake, Minn., Aug. 25, 1885, coming to Douglas County in 1911 and residing at Elgarose. He was married to Mrs. Myrtle Moon, May 4, 1920, at Eugene. The Lundeens lived in Elgarose until 1934 when they moved to Hedding, Calif., where they resided for seven years. They later moved to Oakland, Calif., and returned to Douglas County in 1948, living in Sutherlin.

Lundeen was a member of the Lutheran Church. Surviving are his widow, Mrs. Myrtle Lundeen, Sutherlin; and a sister, Mrs. Celia Johnson, Portland.

Funeral services will be held in the chapel of Long & Orr at 2 p.m. Thursday, with the Rev. Lester G. Olson of Faith Lutheran Church officiating. Concluding services and interment will follow in the Roseburg Memorial Gardens.
