Eddie Machen Is Selected Fighter Of Month By Ring

NEW YORK — "Fighter of the month" in the latest Ring magazine ratings is Eddie Machen, the unbeaten, Redding, Calif., heavyweight who now is No. 2 contender to champion Floyd Patterson. Machen whipped the veteran Joey Maxim at Miami Beach to advance ahead of Archie Moore who dropped to fourth.

Harold Carter took over the third spot by beating Bob Baker, Hurricane Jackson still is No. 1 on the list behind Patterson. Chuck Spieser of Lansing, Mich., took over as chief contender for Moore in the light heavy class and Yolande Pompey of Trinidad moved up to second by knocking out Gerhard Hecht, the European champ.

With Gene Fullmer the new middleweight champ, Sugar Ray Robinson is the No. 1 challenger in the welter division, Gaspar Ortega of Mexico advanced to No. 2 behind champion Carmen Basilio and ex-champ Johnny Saxton. Ortega's second straight over Tony DeMarco, another former champion, did the trick.

In the lightweight division, Larry Boardman fell from second to fourth after his upset by Orlando Zulueta who returned to the top ten.

Wallace (Bud) Smith who will try to win back the lightweight crown from Joe Brown Feb. 13 at Miami Beach, is ranked no better than fifth among the contenders. Italy's Duilio Loi is No. 1.

Lightweights Scheduled For TV Fights Tonight

NORFOLK, Va. — Kenny Lane and Frankie Ryff, two of the nation's leading lightweights, battle tonight in a nationally televised 10-rounder with Lane in particular looking to the bout as a possible stepping stone to a title match.

Lane, who won his last 10 fights and boasts an over-all 45-5 record, is an 8-5 favorite. Ryff has a 21-3 mark.

Aragon Must Face 'Fix' Indictment

LOS ANGELES — Welterweight boxer Art Aragon has lost a courtroom bout to escape trial on an indictment accusing him of trying to fix a fight.

Paul Caruso, the California fighter's attorney, argued unsuccessfully Tuesday that Aragon could not be prosecuted legally in California for an asserted attempt to fix a fight in Texas.

Superior Judge Herbert V. Walker denied the plea for dismissal and ordered Aragon to trial Feb. 7. He was indicted by the Los Angeles County Grand Jury on a charge that he offered Dick Goldstein, also of Los Angeles, money to lose a fight to Aragon in San Antonio last Dec. 13.

Aragon reported sick and the fight did not take place.

Contenders For Vacated Crown Sign For Fight

NEW YORK — The chase for Sandy Saddler's vacated world featherweight boxing crown is under way.

Contenders Miguel Berrios of Puerto Rico and the Bronx and Carmelo Costa of Brooklyn signed Tuesday for a March 22 Madison Square Garden bout.

The Friday night fight will be the first of three to determine a new champion. Saddler relinquished the title Jan. 22 when doctors told him he was "going progressively blind."

Yank Brass Shrugs Off Holdouts; To See Mantle

NEW YORK — The annual seige of holdouts has struck the world champion New York Yankees, but instead of worrying, Yank brass merely shrug it off.

Just 11 of the 41 players on the roster have come to terms. The only happy front-liners are Yogi Berra, Whitey Ford and Billy Martin.

General Manager George Weiss, however, has been all through this sort of thing time and again, so he has adopted a philosopher's view of the players' demands.

"Those are things you have to expect when you win," he shrugged Wednesday, while making plans to confer with Mickey Mantle over the coming weekend.

The largest number of holdouts the Yanks ever had at the start of spring training was 13 in 1954.

Marshall Critical

MELBOURNE — The condition of Australian swimmer John Marshall, who is fighting for his life in the Royal Melbourne hospital, was still extremely critical Wednesday.

It had been unchanged throughout the day after deteriorating late Tuesday night. Doctors would not say how bad the deterioration was.

Marshall has been unconscious since he received severe head injuries in a car crash last Friday.

Bill Smith's High 770 Score Takes Archery

For the fourth straight week, Bill Smith was acclaimed top archer, during the Tuesday night Roseburg Archers weekly shoot. This time the fancy-shooting bowman chalked up a high 770 aggregate score.

It was also announced by club spokesman George Foster, that Smith is tied for second place in the Oregon Indoor Archery League round with an average score of 750, one point behind the leader—who has 751. The shooting has been in free-style.

During Tuesday night's firing, Smith chalked up three perfects while gaining his high total. Wally Crook took second for the session with 606 and George Foster was third with 600 even.

Ladies free-style champ for the night was Kathryn Ullrich who fired 518. Ruth Turner was next high with 497 and Hazel Ward was third at 269.

Steve Duncan topped the junior free-style shooters with 622. Tom Reese was second on a 282 total. Men's instinctive action had Floyd Ward coming home first on a 670 total followed by Ralph Turner at 594 and Earl Ullrich with 586.

Sixteen shooters in all braved the cold weather to take part in the shoot.

Musial Signs For 80; Will Sit Out Games

ST. LOUIS — Stan (The Man) Musial, signed to another \$80,000 contract by the St. Louis Cardinals, says he'll sit out some games next season in a bid for his seventh National League batting title.

"A rest really does a fellow good," he said yesterday at the signing ceremony. "This consecutive game business is just something I got myself involved in."

Now that he's only 48 games short of Gus Suhr's National League consecutive game record of 822, he hates to give it up.

But once he surpasses this mark, the durable 36-year-old first baseman-outfielder plans to act his age and sit out the second games of double-headers.

Musial spurred into the batting lead after the midseason All-Star Game break last year and nursed a .332 mark as late as Aug. 4. He said he got tired then.

He finished at .310, lowest average of his career but fourth in the league.

Al Kaline Signs With Tigers For \$30,000

DETROIT — Al Kaline, who really didn't ask — and didn't get — more money than Mickey Mantle, has signed his 1957 contract with the Detroit Tigers for an estimated \$30,000.

The 1957 salary represents a sizeable increase for the young slugger, who skyrocketed in the summer of 1955, fresh from the Baltimore sandlots. He batted .314 and blasted 27 home runs last season, after his league-leading 340 average along with 27 home runs in 1955.
