

Elgin Baylor's 532 Points Still Lead Northwest Scoring

Elgin Baylor, the chief marksman of the Seattle University Chieftains, went whooping past the 500 mark last week in the collegiate basketball scoring scramble — but he has a Wildcat at his heels.

It's a Linfield Wildcat known as Bill Machamer. He has come with a rush after a late start and this week moved into second place with 371 points to Baylor's 532. Based on averages, Machamer is only 1.5 points back of the Seattle phenom, 28.5 points per game compared to 28.9.

Marv Adams of Whitworth held down third position and Larry Beck of Washington State was fourth in this week's compilations based on games through last Saturday.

Baylor's teammate, Dick Stricklin, held fifth spot and Chuck Curtis of Pacific Lutheran sixth. Eight of the 10 leaders were over the 300 mark, with Bruno Boin of Washington seventh and David Gasser of Northwest Nazarene eighth. Both over 200. Bob Turner of Gonzaga was ninth and Bob Burkhardt of Eastern Washington 10th.

George Shaw Goes On Six-Month Tour

PORTLAND — George Shaw, quarterback for the Baltimore Colts professional football team, said Tuesday he will leave next week for Ft. Benning, Ga., and a six-month tour of active duty with the infantry.

That will make him available to the Colts in mid-August. There had been some thought he would be called for two years of active duty.

Shaw said that like other reserve officers—he's a second lieutenant from his University of Oregon reserve training—he had the option of asking for a straight two years of active duty or of seeking a six-month stint followed by 7½ years of once-a-week meetings and summer encampments.

He said he chose the latter, "probably because of football," but added, "I want it clear. I didn't ask for anything special. This was Uncle Sam's choice."

Shaw underwent a knee operation last month. He said he is exercising regularly to get it in shape for his military tour, to start at Ft. Benning Feb. 12.

CANBERRA, Australia — There have been distinct symptoms of extravagance in the handling of the Melbourne Olympic Games, Prime Minister Robert G. Menzies told a press conference Thursday.

He said the operating loss on the games would be very much more than 200,000 Australian pounds (\$448,000) which the commonwealth and Victorian governments have guaranteed.

Any season without Kentucky heading for the NCAA tournament and Dayton and Duquesne pointing for that big one or the NIT is an unusual one indeed. Last night, all three acted as if the first half of this season was a mistake and it was time to get back to normal.

Kentucky whipped Georgia 84-53 to take over the top rung in the Southeastern Conference. Dayton, now 10 and 7, continued a promising comeback to spill DePaul, 75-

38 — a team it lost to by eight points six weeks ago. Duquesne (10-5) turned back St. Francis of Brooklyn, 71-67.

Each happened to coincide with the reappearance of North Carolina, top-ranked nationally in the Associated Press poll.

No effects from the two week lay-off for exams or a 300-mile bus trip through the mountains to Cullowhee, N.C. were evident as the Tar Heels blasted Western Carolina, 77-59, for their 10th straight.
